## Scripture Reflection

### Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

July 17, 2022

*Genesis 18:1-10a; Colossians 1:24-28; Luke 10:38-42*

This Sunday's readings are about serving and listening to God, something we might not do often enough.

Abraham saw three travelers and he encouraged them to stop. He fed them and gave them rest during the heat of the day. He wasn't aware that they were visitors from God. Abraham just knew that there were travelers who needed water and comfort. God rewarded Abraham and Sarah with a child in their old age.



Jesus was visiting a family. One sister was serving, while the other was sitting and listening to Him talking. Martha was upset because she was doing the serving and wanted Jesus to tell Mary to get up and help. Jesus didn't do it. Not because serving

isn't important because it is, but so is taking time to listen to Jesus.

St. Paul makes it clear that proclaiming Jesus' words and teaching His wisdom is what we're called to do. He was telling that to his followers in Colossae. He spent the last years of his life evangelizing around the Roman Empire.

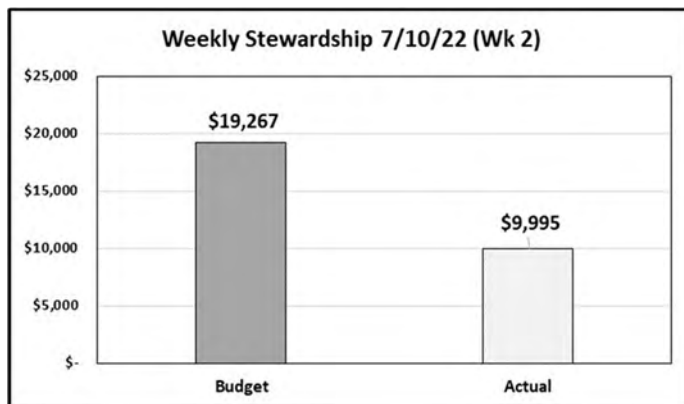
We need to take time to listen to Jesus. Often when we pray, we talk to God. But imagine if you have a friend who does all the talking and you never get a word in edgewise. Wouldn't you feel you have things you want to say? Well, God has things to say to you. He does to all of us. We just have to listen for Him to say them. When you let God talk to you, you'll be surprised how quickly you can get a response. God always responds.

Mary listened to Jesus. Martha was serving. Serving is important as well. Many of us have spent the last couple of years in prayer. Praying that COVID goes away. Praying for the health of our friends and family members. Praying for peace. We wonder if our prayers are being heard. They are, have no doubt. It's time to put some action behind the prayers. It's time to start serving again. Put your words into action. Help those less fortunate than yourself. Provide some comfort like Abraham.

Catholic Christians are so good at praying, giving, serving, and listening to God. We've done it from when Jesus told Peter to feed His sheep. We keep doing it now. Go forth!

### Pope Francis:

When nature is viewed solely as a source of profit and gain, this has serious consequences for society. This vision of "might makes right" has engendered immense inequality, injustice and acts of violence against the majority of humanity, since resources end up in the hands of the first comer or the most powerful: winner takes all. Completely at odds with this model are the ideals of harmony, justice, fraternity and peace as proposed by Jesus. (Laudato Si', 82)

### Reflection:

Two of the readings this Sunday highlight the importance of hospitality. In Genesis, Abraham provides an elaborate feast to the three strangers who are manifestations of God. In Luke's gospel, Martha prepares a multi-course meal for Jesus and probably for his disciples as well. Mary's hospitality lies in her readiness to take Jesus' teachings into her heart. And in his letter to the Colossians, Paul declares that Christ is the life of all things, leading us and all of creation to abundant life. Both service to others and listening to God's word are essential in Christian life. Our hospitable God has created this beautiful planet as a home for all creatures and provides the means for all to live in it. Unfortunately, there are forces in the world today that see our home as an inert money making resource to be plundered, rather than a source of life meant for all. Our service lies in the protection of our common home and of those people in need. These include migrants and refugees who are forced off their lands by climate change, and by ravaging their forests, water sources, and fields for profit. May we honor this call to service by advocating to protect God's creation from exploitation and degradation, and thus protect life itself. (Catholic Climate Covenant)

Loving and gracious God, we thank you for the gift of wise and responsible people in our lives. Through the power of your Spirit they are for us ways of truth and powerful examples of your guiding presence. We pray in a special way for the prophets in our midst, who prick our consciences and challenge us to view life in a different way. We thank you in a special way for our good and wise shepherd, Pope Francis, who helps us to view our created world with eyes of love. We pray that we might live a life of balance between service to protect the earth and prayerful listening to Christ as Mary



did, and that we might increase our awareness of the needs of others, particularly those suffering the effects of environmental exploitation and climate change. We ask all this through Christ our Lord, Amen.
