BON VOYAGE FR. JOJI YOU WILL BE MISSED!!





Scripture Reflection

The Fool's Vanity

Scott Hahn reflects on the
Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings

*Eccl 1:2; 2:21-23; Psalm 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14, 17;
Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11; Luke 12:12-21*



Trust in God—as the Rock of our salvation, as the Lord who made us His chosen people, as our shepherd and guide. This should be the mark of our following of Jesus.

Like the Israelites we recall in this week's Psalm Response, we have made an exodus, passing through the waters of Baptism, freeing us from our bondage to sin. We too are on a pilgrimage to a promised homeland, the Lord in our midst, feeding us heavenly bread, giving us living waters to drink (see 1 Corinthians 10:1-4).

We must take care to guard against the folly that befell the Israelites, that led them to quarrel and test God's goodness at Meribah and Massah.

We can harden our hearts in ways more subtle but no less ruinous. We can put our trust in possessions, squabble over earthly inheritances, kid ourselves that what we have we deserve, store up treasures and think they'll afford us security and rest.

All this is 'vanity of vanities,' a false and deadly way of living, as this week's First Reading tells us.

This is the greed that Jesus warns against in this week's Gospel. The rich man's anxiety and toil expose his lack of faith in God's care and provision. That's why Paul calls greed 'idolatry' in the Epistle this week. Mistaking having for being, possession for existence, we forget that God is the giver of all that we have, we exalt the things we can make or buy over our Maker (see Romans 1:25).

Jesus calls the rich man a 'fool'—a word used in the Old Testament for someone who rebels against God or has forgotten Him (see Psalm 14:1).

We should treasure most the new life we have been given in Christ and seek what is above, the promised inheritance of heaven. We have to see all things in the light of eternity, mindful that He who give us the breath of life could at any moment—this night even—demand it back from us.

Is Jesus calling you? Are you interested in learning what it means to be Catholic? The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) will be starting a new process on Tuesday, September 6, 2022. Year-long for the unbaptized (or unchurched baptized) to prepare for receiving the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. Sessions will be Tuesday evenings at 7 pm. We are planning that these will be in-person. Sacraments will be received at the Easter Vigil, Saturday, April 8, 2023.

If you are interested in **Adult Confirmation**, the process starts on the same day with Confirmation being celebrated on Saturday, November 19, 2022.

Luke 12: Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God.

Laudato Si'

Christian spirituality proposes a growth marked by moderation and the capacity to be happy with little. It is a return to that simplicity which allows us to stop and appreciate the small things, to be grateful for the opportunities which life affords us, to be spiritually detached from what we possess, and not to succumb to sadness for what we lack. This implies avoiding the dynamic of dominion and mere accumulation of pleasures. (222)

Reflection:

In our first reading today the teacher Qoheleth, whose name is a Hebrew word meaning "one who speaks to an assembly," asserts that all human wisdom is empty and pointless. Neither work nor pleasure has any meaning. Only God can sort things out. In the second reading Paul maintains that the meaning of our lives comes from being in Christ, and that we all can put on new selves in the image of God. In this way we are united with God, each other and all of creation. Jesus' parable in Luke's gospel echoes Qoheleth in condemning the hoarding of riches. Instead being grateful for the abundant harvest the man makes plans to keep the harvest, a gift from God, for himself. Unfortunately, the culture in which we live promotes lifestyles of rivalry for possessions, the biggest and best houses, cars, wardrobes, vacations. We often tend to idolize billionaires and celebrities. These things do not promote happiness and a meaningful life. And they are also degrading our planet as well. Today's scripture passages offer us a meditation: What are we hoarding or wasting that we might share with others? How can we show gratitude for the blessings in our lives by wanting less, and caring for our common home?

Prayer:

Gracious God, Creator of All, we raise our hearts in grateful praise for all the beauty that surrounds us. May we learn to respect all as a sacred gift and do what we can to repair the damage we have caused through our consumerism, greed, and carelessness. Grant us an ecological conversion so that we can leave our next generation with a future full of hope where there is enough for all. We ask this in the name of Jesus. Amen.



Anointing of the Sick



The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will take place on Wednesday, August 3rd at the 6:30 pm Mass.

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the **serious nature of the illness** is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

Definition of a parish by Pope Francis: “The parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, and environment for hearing God’s word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration. In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers. It is a community of communities, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a centre of constant missionary outreach.”

—*The Joy of the Gospel, Paragraph 28*


