
It is now the month of November and closer to the year end, but almost **the start of our new liturgical calendar**. I would like everyone to prepare for the culmination of this year's liturgical journey which will take place during the **Sunday of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**. This liturgical event will happen two Sundays from now. I encourage you to do some reflections on our journey of faith especially because we have been through such tumultuous times. We might ask ourselves, "To what or to whom did we cling to on those trying times?" I hope your answer is faith in Jesus and the intercession of Mother Mary, because faith is the logic that we need to understand what is happening.

I was talking to Cindy Phillips (office manager) one afternoon and she told me, somebody had recently asked her, "What is the hardest thing you have experienced in the office? She said to that person, "Those calls for funerals and informing us that a loved parishioner had died. There have been so many deaths this year and the past year. Many of those parishioners I have known for many years and my heart just breaks for these families."

This is the reality where we need the faith in God. And I am also saddened by this situation. I am affected in some ways. But let us be consoled by our faith. Jesus showed us that the finality of our journey is eternal life. So, in a world of uncertainties and grief, faith allows us to move, to continue to live and thrive. It makes us see beyond what we experience. It gives us hope and confirms that there is life for us amidst the difficulties and sorrows we have. Let us then ask the Lord to increase our faith every day. And like Mother Mary, let us embrace and offer our sorrows to God who loves us unconditionally.

Also, I thank you for taking advantage of putting the names of your loved ones in our board and for participating in our Masses for the Faithful Departed last November 2nd. We the Pilgrim Church on earth can help through our prayers and offering of masses for all the souls in Purgatory. We need to do this for they need our prayers.

Lastly, allow me to thank those who generously shared their testimony about Holistic Stewardship on our Yes, Lord Campaign last Sunday. **Thank you, Miss Vivienne Abrugena, Mr. and Mrs. Nancy Watson, Mr. Rodney Langer and Miss Lilly Yarber**. I am hoping, after you have listened to the appeal you now make the decision to consider renewing your Tithes/Pledge commitment to the parish. The widow in our gospel today is a perfect model of how to give to the church. Jesus, "calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, 'Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.'" I said in my homily, "all that we are and all that we have, comes from the Lord." We give the ten percent back to God's altar as our way of thanking Him for all the blessings He has given us. So, let us be very generous like the widow.

The Widow's Faith Scott Hahn reflects on the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

*Readings: 1 Kings 1:10-26, Psalm 146: 7-10,
Hebrews 9:24-28, Mark 12:41-44*

We must live by the obedience of faith, a faith that shows itself in works of charity and self-giving (see [Galatians 5:6](#)). That's the lesson of the two widows in today's liturgy.

The widow in the First Reading isn't even a Jew, yet she trusts in the word of Elijah and the promise of his Lord. Facing sure starvation, she gives all that she has, her last bit of food—feeding the man of God before herself and her family.

The widow in the Gospel also gives all that she has, offering her last bit of money to support the work of God's priests in the Temple.

In their self-sacrifice, these widows embody the love that Jesus last week revealed as the heart of the Law and the Gospel. They mirror the Father's love in giving His only Son, and Christ's love in sacrificing Himself on the Cross.

Again in today's Epistle, we hear Christ described as a new high priest and the suffering servant foretold by Isaiah. On the Cross, He made sacrifice once and for all to take away our sin and bring us to salvation (see [Isaiah 53:12](#)).

And again we are called to imitate His sacrifice of love in our own lives. We will be judged, not by how much we give—for the scribes and the wealthy contribute far more than the widow. Rather, we will be judged by whether our gifts reflect our livelihood, our whole beings, all our heart and soul, mind and strength.

Are we giving all that we can to the Lord—not out of a sense of forced duty, but in a spirit of generosity and love (see [2 Corinthians 9:6-7](#))?

Do not be afraid, the man of God tells us today. As we sing in today's Psalm, the Lord will provide for us, as He sustains the widow.

Today, let us follow the widows' example, doing what God asks, confident that our jars of flour will not grow empty, nor our jugs of oil run dry.

Congratulations to our parishioner on being a recipient of the Jack Cotter Leadership Award

Katie, as she is known to all of us at Catholic Community Services, had a distinguished career at the University of Arizona as an Associate Professor of Climatology and currently holds the title of Joint Associate Professor Emeritus in Hydrology and Atmospheric Sciences.

Katie was nominated for the Jack Cotter Leadership award for her work at Sister Jose Women's Shelter from 2017-2020 and as the Laundry Coordinator at Casa Alitas Welcome Center. In both roles she served with the utmost care and love. Katie says of her work at Casa Alitas, "As the laundry loads appear and reappear day after day, I like to refer to our work as the gift that keeps on giving!" So many aspects of it can be spiritual; creating a clean start and renewing one's spirit, it is not unlike a prayer."

It is important to mention the lifetime of service Katie has given to our Diocese and the Church as a volunteer leader.

Katie began her approach to incorporating faith in her professional life in 1982 when she published an essay for the Tucson Catholics for Peace and Justice regarding the need for compassion for our fragile earth.

Katie has been active since 2007 in various capacities at Our Mother of Sorrows Parish. The list of her leadership and participation is extensive. To name a few, the Christian Life Commission, the Haiti Committee, the Care for Creation Ministry, Liturgy Commission Chair and both a member and President of the Parish Council.

Katie's engagement in leadership in our Diocese extends to establishing a forum on Theology and Science; initiating a Blog, "Justice and Peace Shall Kiss" Holy Ground blog which is currently active supporting the Climate Change Dialogue Laudato Si media event; the Circle of Life Journey Program which is an 11-session overview on the respect for life, Just Faith Just matters and other multi-parish programs regarding Care for Creation, Earth Day events, creation care retreats and a Care for God's Creation Lenten Calendar.

Although this list is extensive enough, it is important to mention that Katie was trained for and appointed a Catholic Climate Ambassador for the Catholic Climate Covenant as well as an Animator for Laudato Si. In these roles she has presented talks on Catholic teaching on the environment and Laudato Si as well as working with other faith communities in Tucson, California, New Mexico and Texas. Tied to this work is also her work with the International Catholic Climate Movement, now called the Laudato Si Movement, which ties to the Vatican's 5-year Action Platform.



Katie is an example of the Servant Leadership embodied in Jack Cotter—to work for the good of all people taking on the humblest tasks while exercising leadership that brings people together in faith and solidarity.


