## The Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time—November 14, 2021

### REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

The first and gospel readings we have today can be very disturbing. It contains language that we consider ominous about cosmic collapse and signs about the end of times. It tells us terrible events to come like when the sun and the moon fail to give light. It means all that we relied on is falling apart.

But these readings are ways for us to be exhorted about the centuries long conflict between good and evil. From a practical point of view, we all experience everyday a piece of this larger struggle between good and evil, grace and sin because it was part of the fallen nature of man. If you see what is happening now, it seems that it is growing and keeps building steam until everything comes to a final and explosive end. This is for us apocalyptic. This is a signal that judgment day (Parousia) is coming but we don't know when: *"And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory."* But when this time comes, God's grace will be present. This is the promise God is giving us. Like the first reading, prophet Daniel says, "At that time there shall arise Michael, the great prince, guardian of your people; at that time your people shall escape." Michael, the great archangel, will come not as avenger but as protector. For those who live their faith, they will be protected.

So, for us Christians, it is important to read these apocalyptic passages of Scripture, and those that deal with the end of things as our way to be awakened and be prepared because the end is inevitable. Next Sunday will be the end of our liturgical year and we celebrate Jesus, the King of the Universe. This is a great assurance that even in our distress and struggle of the conflict between the good and evil outside and within us, we can always draw the power of Lord Jesus Christ; and even at the end of our earthly journey or at the end of the world, Jesus is always there for us. We only need to persevere in our faith.

Lastly, I praise and thank God for all of you. You have always been so supportive and understanding. May God who is never outdone in His generosity bless you more abundantly and keep you and all your loved ones safe!

#### Thirty-third Sunday of Ordinary Time, November 14, 2021

*Daniel 12:1–3; Hebrews 10:11–14, 18; Mark 13:24–32*

“Be vigilant at all times and pray!”

We are coming to the end of the liturgical year. The readings are more apocalyptic, more end of the world. Luke warns about being prepared. The end of the world is going to be difficult for everyone, but hardest on those who are not prepared.

What does prepared mean? It means being a believer. In the times of Daniel, it meant a believer in God. It means following the laws that God gave us: the Ten Commandments. Now that Jesus has come, it means to believe in Jesus as our Savior as well as in God.

Being prepared means to pray. Praying often. Daily. Talking and listening to God. The closer you are to God, the less the tendency to sin. The easier it is to live the life Jesus wants us to live.

So, then we talk about the end of the liturgical year, and we hear about the end of the world. It sounds scary. Stars falling out of the sky. The sun will be darkened. The Son of Man coming on clouds with power and glory sending out his angels to gather His elect.

We want to be part of the elect. Because during the tribulation, we don't want to be a part of those left behind. Out of God's beatific vision. What a dark, lonely place that will be. Hell is not where we want to be.

Jesus says, “but of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.” So, we need to be prepared. Attend Mass, pray often, read your Bible, go to Reconciliation. Those go a long way to being prepared. You'll find others as you work on those.

Stay vigilant against the devil, pray often and you'll be on the path to be prepared!


