A Message from our Pastor

Short Reflection

“Those who testify to the truth belong to the kingdom of God and are ruled by Christ their King”

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King as the culmination of the Church’s liturgical year before we begin a new liturgical year with Advent.

In the gospel of today, Jesus asserts before Pilate that he is a king and clarifies that his kingdom “does not belong to this world.” He rules as King by leading, serving and nourishing them with the Truth because his authority is rooted in the Truth. Beatitudes are his Magna Carta. And LOVE is His only language and expression. He is the Alpha and the Omega, and the reason of our existence.

Now, let us ask ourselves: Is Jesus Christ, our King, and the one ruling in our lives? We need to be sure to have that resolve. Jesus Christ must be in full charge of our lives, and we must give him sovereign power over our whole being.

The Holy Father is inviting everyone to take part in this process of synodality which I believe is what we need in order to grow as a pilgrim church. Jesus is the way from God to man and from man to God. We journey with Christ, through Christ and in Christ. I am asking especially those who are members of the Councils, Parish and School Boards, Religious organizations and all active members of different ministries that your participation is a must. I am hoping and praying that you will take this as your great opportunity to work with the Holy Spirit who is the main agent of the process of renewing our Catholic Church. All of us by virtue of our baptism are called to witness and proclaim the Word of Truth and Life.

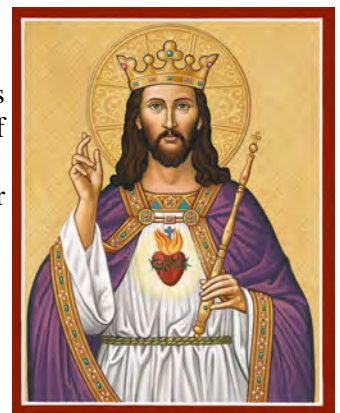
Let us prepare for the Season of Advent

Diocese of Tucson Listening Session Reflection Questions

In November and December 2021, the parishes and other communities within the Diocese of Tucson will hold special listening sessions as part of the global preparations for the 2023 Synod of Bishops: “For a Synodal Church: Communion + Participation + and Mission.” These listening sessions are an invaluable opportunity for everyone in the diocese to both share their experiences and to listen to the experiences of others.

This Synod poses the following fundamental question: *A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, “journeys together.” How is this “journeying together” happening today in your local Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our “journeying together”?*

To help everyone to prepare to take part in a listening session or to take the online survey (available on December 1, 2021), we are happy to share with you these five (5) areas of consideration and some reflection questions. The listening sessions will be built around these important themes, which are taken from the special instructions provided by the Holy See.¹

1. Companions on the Journey

In the Church and in society we are side by side on the same road. In our local Church, who are those who “walk together”? Who are those who seem further apart? How are we called to grow as companions? What groups or individuals are left on the margins?

2. Listening

Listening is the first step, but it requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice. *How is God speaking to us through voices we sometimes ignore, especially people who experience poverty, marginalization, or social exclusion? How are the laity listened to, especially women and young people? What facilitates or inhibits our listening? How well do we listen to those on the peripheries?*

3. Celebration

“Walking together” is only possible if it is based on communal listening to the Word and the celebration of the Eucharist. *How do prayer and liturgical celebrations actually inspire and guide our common life and mission in our community? How do they inspire the most important decisions? How do we promote the active participation of all the faithful in the liturgy?*

4. Dialogue in Church and Society

Dialogue requires perseverance and patience, but it also enables mutual understanding. *To what extent do diverse peoples in our community come together for dialogue? What are the places and means of dialogue within our local Church? How are divergences of vision, or conflicts and difficulties addressed? What particular issues in the Church and society do we need to pay more attention to? How does the Church dialogue with and learn from other sectors of society: the spheres of politics, economics, culture, civil society, and people who live in poverty?*

5. Discerning and Deciding

In a synodal style we make decisions through discernment of what the Holy Spirit is saying through our whole community. *What methods and processes do we use in decision-making? How can they be improved? How do we promote participation in decision-making within hierarchical structures? Do our decision-making methods help us to listen to the whole People of God? What is the relationship between consultation and decision-making, and how do we put these into practice? What tools and procedures do we use to promote transparency and accountability? How can we grow in communal spiritual discernment.*

Scott Hahn reflects on: The Solemnity of Christ the King

What's the truth Jesus comes to bear witness to in the last Gospel of the Church's year?

It's the truth that in Jesus God keeps the promise He made to David of an everlasting kingdom, of an heir who would be His Son, "the first born, highest of the kings of the earth" (see 2 Samuel 7:12-16, Psalm 89: 27-38).

Today's Second Reading, taken from the Book of Revelation, quotes these promises and celebrates Jesus as "the faithful witness." The reading hearkens back to Isaiah's prophecy that the Messiah would "witness to the peoples" that God is renewing His "everlasting covenant" with David (see Isaiah 55:3-5).

ΑΩ But as Jesus tells Pilate, there's far more going on here than the restoration of a temporal monarchy. In the Revelation reading, Jesus calls Himself "the Alpha and the Omega," the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. He's apply to Himself a description that God uses to describe Himself in the Old Testament—the first and the last, the One who call forth all generations (see Isaiah 41:4, 44:6, 48:12).

"He has made the world," today Psalm cries, and His dominion is over all creation (see also John 1:3, Colossians 1:16-17). In the vision of Daniel we hear in today's First Reading, He comes on "the clouds of heaven—another sign of His divinity—to be given "glory and kingship" forever over all nations and peoples.

Christ is King and His Kingdom, while not of this world, exists in this world in the Church. We are a royal people. We know we have been loved by Him and freed by His blood and transformed into "a kingdom, priests for his God and Father" (see also Exodus 19:6, 1 Peter 2:9).

As a priestly people, we share in His sacrifice and in His witness to God's everlasting covenant. We belong to His truth and listen to His voice, waiting for Him to come again amid the clouds.

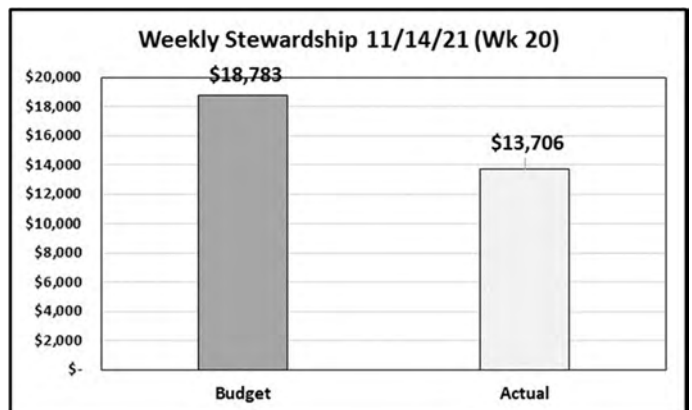
