## First Sunday of Advent-November 28, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

*“In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus;” (1Thess 5:8) And “Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, his mercy endures forever.” (Ps 118:1)*

We give thanks, first and foremost, because it is God’s will that we do so. It is God who has created us and sustains us. It is God who has provided for our salvation through His sacrifice, has given us grace, and shown us love. As God’s love for us is unconditional and everlasting, so too should our gratitude be never-ceasing, regardless of our temporal circumstances.

I hope we all had a very meaningful Thanksgiving celebration with all our families, loved ones and friends.

**First Sunday of Advent:** Today is the beginning of the new liturgical year. Just as the earth needs its cycles of seasons to rejuvenate itself, so we use the seasons of the Church’s year to bring new life to our journey of faith so that we will have a renewed life in Jesus who is our Lord and Savior.

Each year, we discover that there is so much in our life that we need to share to Christ. That is why Advent is a moment of grace for us to open our hearts to allow a new birth of Jesus in us, and grow in our faith. Here, we recognize that when we receive Jesus in our baptism, our faith is not yet totally completed. We must do our part to make sure that this gift of faith will keep growing. How? By being actively prepared for Jesus’ coming every minute, every hour and everyday in our life. The season of Advent is meant to prepare us for this purpose: “Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come.” (Mk. 13:33)



**Synod Listening Sessions:** Watching the video of Msgr. John Lyons on the Synod, he really encourages the parishioners to attend this listening session; be there to share your thoughts and engage in honest discussion about our faith journey and how the church is doing her mission. The Holy Spirit should be invoked to be the one leading and guiding everyone in the discussion. Please save the dates: December 1<sup>st</sup> at 7pm for the Spanish Speaking session and December 5<sup>th</sup> at 2pm for all English Speaking. Both will take place at the Parish Hall.

**On a Personal Note:** I would like to **express my profound “GRATITUDE”** for everything that you do for the OMOS Parish. Your **‘Time, Talent and Treasure’** that you give to make this parish very dynamic are **concrete GIFTS** that as a Pastor I am so grateful to God for. You are the “Church” and without you being active and faithful in the pastoral and spiritual life of our community, we will all get weakened. **Saint Leo the Great** has these words for us: *“The wide extent of Christian grace has given us ever greater reasons for loving our neighbor (and one another). It teaches us to look down on no one and that no one is to be neglected.”*

Let us therefore keep asking more and more from God for the increase of love, kindness and peace in our society. And let us be reminded that **“if we seek first the Kingdom of God, the rest will be given.”**



*May we all have a meaningful Advent Celebration and prepare our heart for His coming.*

#### First Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2021

*Jeremiah 33:14–16; 1 Thessalonians 3:12–4:2;*

*Luke 21:25–28, 34–36*

Happy New Year! No, I'm not nuts! It's the first Sunday of Advent and it's the first day of the new liturgical year! So, Happy New Year!

We start the new year as we wrapped up the old one, talking about the coming of Jesus.

In Jeremiah, he tells the Israelites the God is going to fulfil His promise to them. He is going to send up a shoot for David. Jesus is that shoot. Jesus tells his disciples what will happen when He returns.

Advent is a time of anticipation. We are preparing for Christmas, the birth of Jesus, His first coming. But what we are really anticipating is His second coming. That's why these readings are so centered on the end times, so we can prepare ourselves for whenever the end comes.

We need to be vigilant. Living our lives being ready for the end makes it less scary. We know where we will be going when we die. Our eternity won't be in question. The tribulations that Jesus tells us that are coming, won't be so bad because our souls are His. Preparation is the key. Like it is in everything.

Enjoy your first Sunday of Advent. Secure in the knowledge that you are ready for whatever comes. Prepare for His coming, whenever He comes.

O come, O come, Emmanuel,  
And ransom captive Israel,

## Christian Life Commission

**ANGEL TREE:** As we move into the season of Advent it is time to begin preparation for our Angel Tree Outreach. The Angel Tree is a wonderful way for us as a parish to put feet on the gospel. Through the Angel Tree Project we can affirm the dignity of the least among us and give them a helping hand. Jesus tells us, "Whenever you did for the least of my brothers, you did for me." (Mt 25:40) How can we challenge ourselves to see Christ in the poor and vulnerable this Christmas? .

**The Angel Tree does look different again this year.** Due to the pandemic we can not hang angels on a tree. Instead we ask that you purchase gifts from the list below. *During these times we are happy to shop for you. You can make a donation for any agency and we will be happy to purchase items from their list.*

Gifts may be dropped in the back of the church or at the Parish Office during the week. Gift cards and monetary donations for all agencies can be dropped in the Parish mailbox anytime or at the office during the week.

**St. Vincent de Paul & Project Outreach** —They are requesting toys, building sets, balls, books, dolls, art & craft sets, ear buds, make-up/nail polish, play dough, card games, slime, cars, and games for children from birth to 16 years. (*Fry's Gift Cards, McDonald Gift Cards and \$15—\$25 Gift Cards for Wal-Mart and Target are always in short supply.*)

**Casa Maria, Primavera Shelter, TIHAN, Poverello House, Stand Up for Kids and Sr. Jose Women's Shelter** — These agencies are soliciting toilet paper, sweatshirts/hoodies, hats/beanies, gloves, blankets, and toiletries. Snack items such as granola bars, trail mix, apple sauce, cheese or peanut butter crackers, and pop top cans of ravioli, or chili. Gift cards are helpful in meeting immediate needs. *Especially needed are men's and women's socks. (Women prefer low cut socks.) Gift cards to fast food or discount stores help to meet the immediate needs of these agencies.*

**Respect Life— Reachout Women's Center helps mothers in need** and is requesting diapers, wipes and gift cards to discount stores such as Target and Wal-Mart. They also appreciate donations of other baby items.

(You might have noticed that some ministries are no longer on the Angel Tree such as the Haiti Project and the Orphanage and Barrio Outreach in Agua Prieta. They continue to be ministries of the parish and we will assist them as the need arises.)

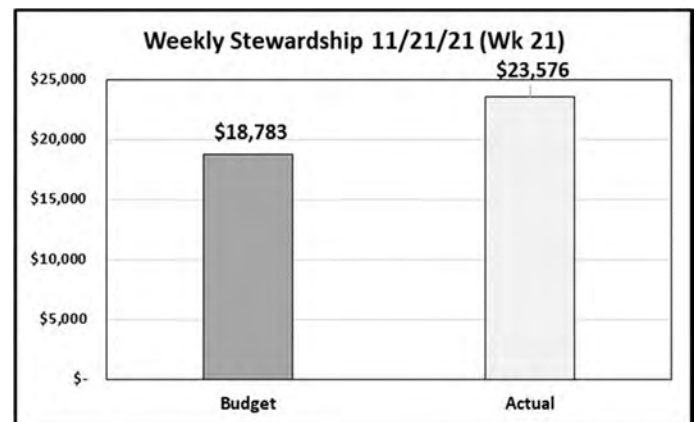
