The Baptism of the Lord—January 9, 2022

Dear OMOS Parishioners,

Today our Church season of Christmas comes to a close because the baby Jesus has become a man. Jesus comes as an adult to the Jordan River to fulfill what He was born to do – teaching, healing, forgiving, finding and repairing. His public ministry begins.

Today also, we are asked to leave our Bethlehem and be ready to embrace the ministry that we are asked to do when we were all baptized – doing extra ordinary love in the ordinary routine of our lives. Liturgically, we start the “Ordinary Time” of our season. Yet, the reality is, Ordinary Time is where life is lived. People are born, grow up, marry and have families in ordinary time. Yes, ordinary time is not filled with decorations, lights, charming songs, and colorful flowers. It is filled with reality – the reality of sin and the reality of grace!

When we enter the church, we bless ourselves with Holy Water as a reminder of our baptism. It goes back to a time when baptismal font was always at the front door and people would touch themselves with the baptismal water to recall their baptismal commitment.

When we were all baptized we were born to new life in Christ. And our Second Reading illustrates it for us perfectly: “When the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life.”

Our Baptism is grace given to us through Faith. Fidelity to our faith is what we owe our Church and our community. As baptized, we are all called to do a mission – that is to continue the work of Christ, to love, serve and bring souls to heaven.

Sound System Update: Steve Contreras, our Parish Business Manager updated us about the upcoming sound improvement project. Work is scheduled to begin on January 11th. Temporarily, daily masses, weekend masses and all other church sacraments and devotions will be moved to the Parish Hall beginning on the 11th (Tuesday) until February 1st. I am asking for your indulgence to bear with the situation. I am so hopeful that this improvement project for our sound system will fix all the issues that we have been enduring all these years. Thank you for your understanding!

Pima County Indoor Mask Mandate: Bishop Weisenburger strongly urged all Pastors to highly encourage parishioners to make use of facemasks and social distancing for all parish activities and public worship. I am here to remind you that it is our responsibility to take care of ourselves and of one another. Let us be extra cautious while this Omicron variant continues to infect more people and hospitalizations are increasing across our nation. The good Bishop reminds us that “Christianity has always acknowledged a balance between individual rights and the rights of the community. At the critical juncture in history, we must do all that we can for the health and wellbeing of the community.”

Christmas and New Year’s Collections: Thank you so much for your generosity at Christmas and New Year’s with your very generous tithing. It has allowed us be above our budget for the first time this year.

Lastly, may I remind you that our baptism is “the gateway to life in the Spirit” and our birth to eternal life. It makes us participants in the Divine life of the Holy Trinity through sanctifying grace, reborn as sons and daughters of God and incorporates us into Christ and His church to be made sharers in her mission.

Prayers requested: Please pray for Bishop Kicanas as he recovers from open heart surgery. We wish him a swift and trouble free recovery.

Congratulations: We congratulate Fr. Joji on his 16 years (January 6th) of priestly ministry. We are so grateful to have him here at OMOS as one of our associate pastors.

The Anointing

Scott Hahn reflects on The Baptism of the Lord

Readings: *Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Psalm 29:1-4, 9-10;*
Acts 10:34-38; Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

The liturgy last week revealed the mystery of God's plan—that in Jesus all peoples, symbolized by the Magi, have been made 'coheirs' to the blessings promised to Israel. This week, we're shown how we claim our inheritance.

Jesus doesn't submit to John's baptism as a sinner in need of purification. He humbles Himself to pass through Jordan's waters in order to lead a new 'exodus'-opening up the promised land of heaven so that all peoples can hear the words pronounced over Jesus today, words once reserved only for Israel and its king: that each of us is a beloved son or daughter of God (*see Genesis 22:2; Exodus 4:22; Psalm 2:7*).

Jesus is the chosen servant Isaiah prophesies in today's First Reading, anointed with the Spirit to make things right and just on earth. God puts His Spirit upon Jesus to make Him "a covenant of the people," the liberator of the captives, the light to the nations, Jesus, today's Second Reading tells us, is the One long expected in Israel, "anointed...with the Holy Spirit and power."

The word messiah means 'one anointed' with God's Spirit. King David was "the anointed of the God of Jacob" (*see 2 Samuel 23:1-17, Psalm 18:51, 132:10,17*). The prophets taught Israel to await a royal offshoot of David, upon whom the Spirit would rest (*see Isaiah 11:1-2; Daniel 9:25*).

That's why the crowds are so anxious at the start of today's Gospel. But it isn't John they're looking for. God confirms with His own voice what the angel earlier told Mary: Jesus is the Son of the Most High, come to claim the throne of David forever (*see Luke 1:32-33*).

In the Baptism that He brings, the voice of God will hover over the waters as a fiery flames, as we sing in today's Psalm. He has sanctified the waters, made them a passageway to healing and freedom—a fountain of new birth and everlasting life.

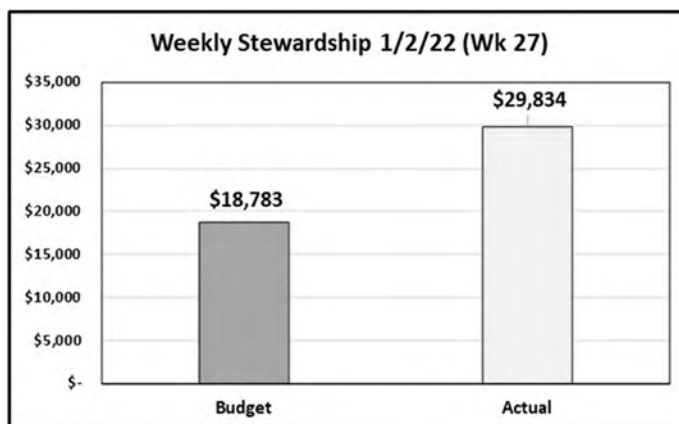

This week's actual stewardship of \$29,834 was \$11,051 above the budget weekly average of \$18,783 due to EFTs and year-end gifts. The Parish is above our budget for the first time this year by 6%. Thank you all for your faithful and sacrificial support of the parish.

*****Sound System Update*****

After several delays, I am pleased to announce that the church sound improvement project is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, January 11th. Daily Masses and weekend Masses will be moved to the Parish Hall beginning that Tuesday. Completion of the project is anticipated by Tuesday, February 1st. This project will finally address the chronic issues parishioners have been enduring including echo, muddiness, volume changes, cracking, popping, and hearing loop issues.

New directional speakers will be installed in the ceiling, including replacing the existing broken speakers hanging over the altar. New sound deck components designed to work together will be installed in the sound closet and tuned to eliminate echo and feedback, so the person sitting in the back row will hear the same thing as the person sitting in the front row. New decorative echo suppressing panels will be installed along the back walls of the sanctuary.

A new wireless assisted listening system will be installed replacing the outdated existing hearing loop system. This assisted listening system will work with parishioners' existing hearing devices. For those who may have older units, lanyards with receivers will be available to check out during Mass and then returned after Mass. This system will also provide better sound for livestreaming Masses and events.

We are very excited for this long-awaited improvement that will enhance our worship experience in the church. We hope you like it, as well. Stay tuned for more announcements on the temporary transition to the Hall during the project.
