Dear Parishioners

Reflection: The yardstick Jesus is giving us to measure being blessed are situations so contradictory to our human standard. From a secular standpoint, we can easily identify them as curses rather than blessings.

To be “blessed” is to be “happy”. Some versions of the Bible use the expression “happy are those”...If we therefore replace the word “blessed” with “happy” in the expressions “Blessed are you poor”, “Blessed are you that hunger”, “Blessed are you that weep”, “Blessed are you when men hate you, and when they exclude you and insult you, and denounce your name as evil”, we can then ask the questions: how can one be happy who is poor? How can one be happy who is hungry? How can one be weeping and still be happy? How can one be rejoicing when rejected, hated or denounced? There must be something more in the Beatitudes than the ordinary human language. This language- we call it PARADOX. According to St. Maximos, the Confessor, it is a different way of LIVING and BEING. It tends to run contrary to our human reasoning (of course not discarding it) but by transcending its inherent limitations so that God’s will could be made manifest here on earth. Life being a paradox is hard to understand especially in a culture where we value pragmatism, fame and reputation, wealth and success. The gospel we have today teaches us a totally different perspective. It runs contrary to what we prefer.

At this point, it becomes important to note that Jesus never left the “controversial blessedness” unexplained. In what followed, He said why such bitter and hard moments should be preferred. Such reasons include the fact that there is truly endless joy being offered. Consider the happiness of: ...”yours is the kingdom of God,” “you shall be satisfied,” “you shall laugh,” “your reward is great in heaven.” These are states of happiness that do not know any end. Happiness that is eternal. The fact is that the road to true happiness is not always joyful at the beginning. The best way is not always the easy way, and the short cuts of life might often have adverse effects.

Let’s pray for greater courage to respond with greater surrender to our loving Lord and find how to live the paradoxes of life.

Annual Catholic Appeal: Last week we heard Bishop Edward Weisenburger, through a video, asking each of us to support and contribute to this year’s Annual Catholic Appeal. We know that stewardship is our opportunity to help the Church. I ask you to pray for more participation in this year’s Appeal and please I encourage you to contribute towards this cause in any amount that you think you are happy to share. You should have received a letter and envelope this past week. Please, return them with your pledge on or before May 31, 2022. *Together in Hope and Charity*, we will make our commitment!

Catholic Schools Week: I would like to extend my gratitude to everyone who made the Catholic Schools Week more meaningful. The appreciations made by our students to the faculty and staff, by the school to the students and their parents and families were very touching and inspiring. The music brought to our grounds by Salpointe High School Orchestra made the cold weather that day perfect for us. I could not help but praise God for all the blessings He continues to shower upon our OMOS School Family.

Church Assisted Listening System Bulletin Announcement

The new church sound system now includes an Assisted Listening System (ALS) to assist hearing impaired parishioners and visitors to hear better directly what is being said and sung during Masses. Unfortunately, our old under the floor t-coil loop system has not been supported by the manufacturer for years. However, our new system gives us options for the hearing impaired, so if one method does not work well, there are alternatives:

The new sound system connects automatically with newer in-ear assisted hearing systems.

For other T-coil devices, a lightweight neck “T-coil” loop and receiver device may be worn creating a T-coil loop for the individual. This will allow the person to sit anywhere in the sanctuary and receive the direct feed from the system. This is the same technology that is now used for livestreaming the Masses.

For this method to work properly, a cell phone app is required, and your phone must remain with you while using the loop. Please talk to your hearing professional about this method if you have questions.

For others who do not wear a hearing aid or would like to supplement their hearing aid, an earpiece that is worn around your ear connected to the receiver may be worn. Like the loop, you may sit anywhere in the sanctuary and get a direct feed from the system. No other assisted hearing device is necessary with this method.

The neck loops, earpieces, and receivers are available for church services only and must be returned immediately after the end of the service. Due to the limited availability of these devices, they are available on a first come, first served basis. It is recommended that reservations be made in advance by calling the parish office. We will be ordering additional devices, but I would like to get count of how many parishioners would be interested in this technology and what Masses they attend.

The devices will be available to check out in the Liturgical Ministers Sacristy in the back of the church near the Pieta statue and candles down the hallway. Your patience is very much appreciated as we put together this new process to handle the devices. If you are interested in volunteering to assist us in administering this new ministry, please call the parish office.

I hope you all enjoy a better listening experience in our sanctuary that enhances our worship and draws us all closer to the Lord.

Rich in Poverty: Scott Hahn reflects on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The blessings and woes we hear in today's Gospel mark the perfection of all the wisdom of the Old Testament.

That wisdom is summed up with marvelous symmetry in today's First Reading and Psalm: Each declares that the righteous—those who hope in the Lord and delight in His Law—will prosper like a tree planted near living waters. The wicked, who put their “trust in human beings,” are cursed to wither and die.

Jesus is saying the same thing in the Gospel. The rich and poor are, for Him, more than members of literal economic classes. Their material state symbolizes their spiritual state.

The rich are “the insolent” of today's Psalm, boasting of their self-sufficiency, the strength of their flesh, as Jeremiah says in the First Reading. The poor are the humble, who put all their hope and trust in the Lord.

We've already seen today's dramatic imagery of reversal in Mary's Magnificat. There, too, the rich are cast down while the hungry are filled and the lowly exalted (see [Luke 1:45–55](#), also 16:19–31).

That's the upside-down world of the Gospel: in poverty, we gain spiritual treasure unimaginable; in suffering and even dying “on account of the Son of Man,” we find everlasting life.

The promises of the Old Testament were promises of power and prosperity—in the here and now. The promise of the New Covenant is joy and true freedom even amid the misery and toil of this life.

But not only that. As Paul says in today's Epistle, we're to be pitied if our hope is “for this life only.”

The blessings of God mean that we'll laugh with the thanksgiving of captives released from exile (see [Psalm 126:1–2](#)), feast at the heavenly table of the Lord (see [Psalm 107:3–9](#)), “leap for joy” as John the Baptist leapt in his mother's womb (see [Luke 6:23](#); [1:41](#), [44](#)), and rise with Christ, “the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.”


