PASTOR'S CORNER

February 20, 2022

Sunday Reflection: In our First Reading today, we learn about King Saul's relentless hunt for the life of David. He pursues him as far as the desert of Ziph with three thousand picked men from Israel. As the search unfolds, the predator became a prey as David and his military assistant Abishai find Saul and Abner, his commander in a deep sleep. This is the best opportunity to accomplish revenge.

Abishai, David's assistant, offers to kill Saul with one thrust of the spear, but David would not allow anyone to harm nor lay hands on Saul, the Lord's anointed. Standing on a remote hilltop opposite of Saul and Abner, David announces and shows them the spear and jug he collected from Saul's head as indications that he had the opportunity to kill him as retaliation for all the evil plots against him. But, David said, "The Lord will reward each man for his justice and faithfulness for today, though the Lord delivered you into my grasp, I would not harm the Lord's anointed." David then, returned kindness for wickedness, he gave love in exchange for hatred. In short, he overcame evil with good.

Now, in the Gospel we have today, our Lord commands us to love one's enemies and to bless those who curse us. This means with this command, we need to include non-retaliation and non-violence, unconditional kindness, and forgiveness, refraining from judging people and unfettered charity.

Looking at David's benevolence and kind attitude to King Saul who was out to kill him and our Lord's instructions today in the Gospel, we notice what may seem like an "aberration" in the "norm" of human actions and reactions. But this is God's wisdom, His ways are different from our ways, and his thoughts are different from our thoughts (Isaiah 55:8-9).

In God's ways and thoughts, the good should prevail over evil. St. Paul instructs that we should not repay evil for evil, but we should repay evil with good; that means we need to be careful to do what is right in the eyes of God and in everyone. We should not allow evil to overcome us, but we should strive to overcome evil with goodness and kindness.

Dear friends, you might be at a stage in your life now where you may be hurting over something that happened or someone and you're planning to retaliate or take revenge. You might be "right" because you are not at fault and you have all reasons to do so. However, take a little time to think through what our Lord is telling us today:

"Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To anyone who asks, give. To anyone who offends you, forgive. Do to others as you would have them do to you."

Yes, indeed, the "Lord is kind and merciful!"

Valentine's Day Adoration: To have spent in front of the Eucharistic Jesus in adoration with our OMOS students and their teachers was the best Valentine's Day celebration ever. The whole two hour spiritual event was truly very meaningful. The students including the elementary age students, were very reverent, silent, and focused on the Eucharistic Jesus on the altar. Thank you all so much for making this event as wonderful as it was.

Eucharistic Love and Devotion: There's no doubt in my heart that this parish is very much Eucharistic. I am just so inspired by the attendance of our daily masses. We have individuals and families who have been so regular and faithful in coming to attend to it. I am also grateful for our Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers whose commitment never fails. I am praying that we will keep growing in numbers and more people will truly come to actively participate in the Holy Mass.

Lent is Coming: I am reminding you that March 2nd is already Ash Wednesday. It's just over a week from now. This is the start of our Lenten Season. Let's all be ready for this beautiful and holy season. Schedules will be posted. The ashes are meaningful only if you receive them within the Mass.

Sacrament of Confession: I am encouraging our parishioners to take advantage of this beautiful sacrament of healing and reconciliation. We have it every Wednesday from 4pm to 5pm and Saturday from 3:00pm to 4:30pm. We priests appreciate it if you come ready and have your list of what to confess. To grow in holiness is to regularly come in humility to get washed from our impurities and receive God's grace of forgiveness. After all, the Lord is the great healer of mind, soul and body.

Christian Education/Formation

Seventh Sunday of Ordinary Time, February 20, 2022

*1 Samuel 26:2, 7–9, 12–13, 22–23;
1 Corinthians 15:45–49; Luke 6:27–38*

“I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another.” *John 13:34*

In 1 Samuel, David showed Saul how to love your enemies by not killing him when David had the chance. The whole reading from Luke goes onto explain how to do it. Jesus starts with loving your enemies and continues through stop judging and condemning others.

Think of how Saul felt when he realized that David and his men were in their camp while they were sleeping. David was able to take Saul’s spear from above Saul’s head. David’s men would have been able to kill them all. But David knew that Saul was anointed (selected) by God and God would not have been happy if they would have killed him. So, David told them not to kill them. Once they were out of Saul’s reach, they made it clear to Saul what they had done. Saul was trying to prevent David from becoming the next king. Try to imagine the shock and fear in Saul’s camp!

Jesus took this much further. Rather than not killing someone, Jesus commands us to love everyone. To love our friends, which is easy, to love our enemies, which seems downright impossible. He explains how to do it. Do good to those who hate you. Bless them. Pray for them. It makes it easier to contemplate. If you have people, you are angry at, pray for them. It will ease your anger. Forgive them. It will lighten your load.

Nowhere does Jesus say that you have to put yourself in a dangerous position. If you have been able to extract yourself from an abusive marriage, say, you’ll need to forgive the abuser. It will take a while, believe me. But it’s good for you. No one says you need to be in contact with the abuser and don’t be. That’s not necessary for forgiveness.

Jesus also says to stop judging and condemning others. Leave that to God. We make judgements based on human understanding. Our mercy isn’t anywhere close to God’s. We need to work on that. Being more generous and more forgiving. Jesus says, ‘the measure you forgive, will in return be measured out to you.’






