## *The First Sunday of Lent-March 6, 2022*

### Pastor's Corner

**Reflection:** Last Wednesday, all Masses were all well attended. Praise God! And we gathered that day to receive ashes. We were also told to ‘repent and believe in the Gospel’ or ‘to remember that we are dust, and to dust we shall return.’ **Three key words** here that we need to take to heart as we journey together in this holy season of Lent: **Remember, Repent, and Believe.** We need to remember our lowly beginnings and in humility accept that we came from dust and to dust we all return. We also acknowledge our sinfulness by way of repentance and believe in the power of God’s good news to transform our whole being. We are all invited to Remember, Repent and Believe as God’s community, in order for us to re-evaluate our lives and return to God.

We say the Season of Lent lasts forty days, as the Latin word, ‘Quadragesima’ suggests. ‘Forty’ is symbolic. The people of Israel walked in the wilderness for forty years (Dt 8:2). Practically, it was a new generation that entered ‘the Promised Land’ (Num 32:13). The number forty symbolizes a time of prayer, the duration that Moses spent in communion with God on Mount Sinai (Ex 24:17-18; 34-28). It also symbolizes every person’s journey to the mount of God as shown by Elijah “walking for forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, God’s Mountain” (1Kings 19:8). It is this kind of journey that the Season of Lent is inviting us to enter. It is the nature of this journey that the gospel reading today speaks to us and hopefully prepares us to have deeper communion with God.

Every year on the first Sunday of Lent the liturgy of the word invites us to meditate on the temptations of Jesus. The synoptic gospels (Mk, Mt, Lk) capture at the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus what John narrates as a lifetime of discernment of the will of the Father (read Jn 6:15, 30-31; 7:3). The narrative of the temptations of Jesus in the synoptic gospels resembles those of the people of Israel in the wilderness. On another level, in Jesus “we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin” (Heb 4:15). Therefore, the temptations of Jesus are also our own. Today’s gospel reminds us that the journey of our life is often marked by trials and temptations, even as the Spirit leads us forward. How do we respond to the temptations we have? Do we remain weak and helpless? Or do we turn to God for help and ask for His grace?

**The value of the Sacrament of Confession:** Allow me to highlight this important sacrament. I would like to shed light on the value of the Sacrament of Reconciliation from the perspective of St. John Paul II. He once said: *“If you are genuinely sorry and try to change your life, God will forgive you and keep forgiving you. However, if you choose to hold onto your sins, you cannot be forgiven because you do not want to forgive yourself enough to receive Divine Mercy.”*

In his 2002 Apostolic letter entitled *Misericordia Dei*, the Holy Father writes: “It is clear that penitents living in a habitual state of serious sins and who do not intend to change their situation cannot validly receive absolution” (#7)

The church teaches that for a person to validly receive absolution, the following conditions must be met:

**Contrition:** This means that one must be sorry for offending God who loves him and whom he loves above all things. He must have that sorrow of his soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again.

**Confession:** This means that the penitent must confess everything to the priest without willfully withholding any tiny detail. Once one is unwilling to confess appropriately, it indicates they’re not very sorry for their sins and cannot receive valid absolution.

**Satisfaction:** This means that after one has been forgiven, they need to make up for their sins. They need to do penance, make resolutions and do restitutions - that is to restore all they have damaged by their sins. They also need to get rid of all instruments of sins in their possessions and stay far away from anything that would lead them to temptations.

For instance, somebody lives in an adulterous union and they go to confession. And then after they made their confession, they return home where they live in sin. If they do not do something to free themselves from this situation, they cannot receive absolution nor receive forgiveness.

I hope, this gives all of us better appreciation of the sacrament of confession.

One final exhortation from St. Pope John Paul II: *“Unless it appears otherwise, the priest must assume that, in confessing his or her sins, the penitent is genuinely sorry and is determined to make amends...Clearly, when there is no sorrow and amendment, the confessor (priest) is obliged to tell the penitent that he or she is not ready for absolution. If absolution was given to those who actually say that they have no intention of making amends, the rite would become a mere fiction; indeed, it would look almost like magic, capable perhaps of creating the semblance of peace, but certainly not that deep peace of conscience which God’s embrace guarantees.”*

**Suggestions to do during Lent:** 1.) Give up sin – let us turn away from sins, mediocrity in our prayers, and our cynical attitude. 2.) PRAY – let us come to Mass very regularly, spend time in the cenacle chapel for adoration, pray the rosary and the stations of the cross. 3.) Abstain and Fast – let us cut down on the amount of food and drink we take. Let us also give up on some entertainment and the use of technology. 4.) Do meditative reading – let us nourish our faith by spending time in quiet reading and reflection. Prayerful reading of God’s word each day opens our hearts to the Holy Spirit and make us our day peaceful. 5.) Do good works and give alms – let us help those in need and pray for them especially those in Ukraine and other innocent people. Let us give cheerfully to God through supporting our parish and all other ministries.

**Pray for Ukraine:** Pray for peace and justice for Ukraine, and especially for members of the Ukrainian Catholic Church. They are in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church but their faith is illegal in Russia. —*Bishop Edward Weisenburger*

### Forty Days: Scott Hahn reflects on the First Sunday of Lent

#### Readings

*Deuteronomy 26:4-10, Psalm 91:1-2, 10-15;  
Romans 10:3-13; Luke 4:1-13*



In today's epic Gospel scene, Jesus relives in His flesh the history of Israel.

We've already seen that, like Israel, Jesus has passed through water and been called God's beloved Son (*see Luke 3:22; Exodus 4:22*). Now, as Israel was tested for forty years in the

wilderness, Jesus is led into the desert to be tested for forty days and nights (*see Exodus 15:25*).

He faces the temptations put to Israel: Hungry, He's tempted to grumble against God for food (*see Exodus 16:1-13*). As Israel quarreled at Massah, He's tempted to doubt God's care (*see Exodus 17:1-6*). When the Devil asks for His homage, He's tempted to do what Israel did in creating the golden calf (*see Exodus 32*).

Jesus fights the Devil with the Word of God, three times quoting from Moses' lecture about the lessons Israel was supposed to learn from its wilderness wanderings (*see Deuteronomy 8:3, 6:16, 12-15*).

Why do we read this story on the first Sunday of Lent?

Because like the biblical sign of forty (*see Genesis 7:12; Exodus 24:18, 34:28; 1 Kings 19:8; Jonah 3:4*) the forty days of Lent are a time of trial and purification.

Lent is to teach us what we hear over and over in today's readings. "Call upon me and I will answer," the Lord promises in today's Psalm. Paul promises the same thing in today's Epistle (*quoting Deuteronomy 30:14; Isaiah 28:16; Joel 2:32*).


This was Israel's experience, as Moses reminds his people in today's First Reading: "We cried to the Lord... and He heard." But each of us is tempted, as Israel was, to forget the great deed He works in our lives, to neglect our birthright as His beloved sons and daughters.

Like the litany of remembrance Moses prescribes for Israel, we should see in the Mass a memorial of our salvation, and "bow down in His presence," offering ourselves in thanksgiving for all He has given us.

**Today's Gospel is about Jesus being tempted by the devil in the desert. (Luke 4:1-13)**

**Reflection:** How are we tempted by an obsession with a consumerist lifestyle no matter what the cost is to the environment? It is easy to get caught up in needless buying and spending. To produce a single consumer product requires material resources from the Earth. This means the more products produced, the more Earth's resources are used.

**Action:** This Lent be mindful of your consumption and buying habits. Try shopping at a farmers market, eating less meat, or planting a garden so you can grow your own vegetables. Help the environment by limiting the use of single use plastics.

**Facts:** It is estimated that 50% of all plastic produced is for single-use purposes. Plastics now make up more than 90% of the trash floating in the ocean. Each year 10 million tons of plastic are dumped in our oceans. That's equal to more than a garbage truck load every minute!

**Activity & Prayer:** Enjoy the gifts of nature by taking a walk and reflecting on God's gifts of creation. This can be done alone or walk with family and friends and talk about how you see God reflected in nature. **Then pray:** Loving God, we thank you and praise you for the beauty in all creation but most of all for \_\_\_\_\_ (each person on the walk can share a favorite part of nature). Thank you for the beauty of our common home. Amen.

### NEW LENTEN OUTREACH PROJECT Reaching Out to the Homeless



This Lent our parish is putting feet on the gospel by reaching out to the homeless men and women in Tucson through the Sr. Jose Women's Center and the Poverello House. Both of these reach out to the least among us and give them a helping hand, while treating them with the dignity and respect they deserve. Jesus tells us, "Whenever you did for the least of my brothers, you did for me." (Mt 25:40) How can we challenge ourselves to see Christ in the homeless this Lent?

Lent is a good time to look at how we are practicing the Corporal Works of Mercy which include: Feeding the Hungry, Giving Drink to the Thirsty, Clothing the Naked and Sheltering the Homeless. Homeless men and women struggle every day just to meet their basic daily needs.

#### How Your Change Can Help



1. Find a jar or container to collect change. Due to the pandemic we are unable to hand out jars this year.
2. At dinner pray for the homeless people in Tucson.
3. Add change to your jar each day.
4. On the weekend of Palm Sunday, April 9th & 10th bring your jars of change or envelope marked Lenten Outreach and put it in the baskets on the steps in front of the altar before or after Mass. Jars can also be brought to the Parish office M-F during normal business hours.
5. The money collected will be divided between the Sr. Jose Women's Center and the Poverello House.




