The Third Sunday of Lent-March 20, 2022

Pastor's Corner

Reflection: On this third Sunday of Lent, I invite you all to reflect on REPENTANCE. At times, we are tempted to view repentance as something not so important. The truth is, it is an essential step towards our conversion. It is a way through which God imparts his grace to us. Repentance is being sincerely sorry for the sin we commit and a firm resolve not to commit it again deliberately. A true and contrite heart melts God's heart to give us his compassion, mercy, forgiveness and love.

In our second reading, Paul reminded us of the consequences if one is deliberately going against the will of God. He was telling the Corinthians that what happened to the Israelites (they were struck down in the desert) was the result of their hard headedness and not pleasing God. That is to say: they sinned against God. Hence, Paul concluded by reminding us that "All these happened as a warning and were written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age." In his letter to the Romans, he puts it directly: "The wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life" (Rom 6:23.)

More so, today's gospel, gives us urgency when Jesus said: "if you do not repent, you will perish." Here, He simply warns us of the negative consequences of living a sinful life and wants us to repent and live a righteous life.

The good news for us is that we are given all opportunities to learn from the failures and consequences of the wrong actions made by the Israelites. Now, God is assuring us that He will give second chances to all who call upon the Lord asking for His forgiveness. Jesus wants us to listen to his voice and take the courage to make that renewal of life. This is a call to repentance for the times we neglected and failed to love both God and our neighbors; for the times we chose evil over good, and for those moments, we despaired and displayed a remarkable lack of faith in God.

Parish Lenten Mission: I would like you to mark your calendar in red. Come April 4th, 5th, & 6th, immediately after the 8:30am Mass, we invite you to listen to our very own Priests for an hour of reflection on Lent. Fr. John Gonzales will emphasize his sharing about the discipline of Lent – how are Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving ways to grow in our spirituality and holiness. Msgr. Tom Cahalane will be highlighting the value of the Holy Eucharist in our life. The Holy Mass is the source and summit of God's presence and life. And for me, I will be sharing about the brokenness that we all experience and highlighting God's mercy and forgiveness. We will be looking forward to these grace-filled days for our parish.

Scott Hahn is Coming: I am reminding you that Scott Hahn is coming to Tucson next Saturday, March 26th. He is a most sought after and respected scholar who is going to give a solid talk on the Eucharist and the Word of God. The venue will be at St. Thomas the Apostles Church from 9:00am to 1:00pm. Please register now (*see page 6 for registration information*).

Lastly: I ask everyone to really pray harder for the intention of the situation in Ukraine. I have read in the news that the Holy Father Pope Francis is going to consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Let us continue doing adoration and praying the rosary for peaceful dialogue and the end of war between Russia and Ukraine. Let us also pray for the safety of the civilians and protection of all children and other vulnerable individuals.

Scripture Reflection

**Third Sunday of Lent,
March 20, 2022**

*Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15; 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12;
Luke 13:1-9*

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”

We are at the halfway point of Lent. This very penitential season of the church. The time to go to confession if you haven't recently. It is the time to repent. To mend our broken relationship with God and each other.

Jesus wants us to do is repent of our sins and lead a life loving God and each other and following God's laws.

That's what Jesus was trying to get across to those who questioned him about Pilate mingling the blood or the tower falling in Siloam. The Jews believed that those people must have brought the bad misfortunes upon themselves due to being bad people. They had been told that what they did or what their parents did affected their future, but Jesus told them how they died wasn't related to how they lived. It wasn't "luck."

Jesus told them that repenting of sin saves them from eternal death, along with reorienting themselves to God.

What God is trying to do is cultivate us to grow closer to Him, like the gardener was trying to do with the fig tree. By giving it fertilizer and more water, loosening up the roots, it might encourage the tree to flower, attract bees, and then produce fruit. God does the same thing with us. He loves us. He's patient with us. He listens to our prayers and answers them. God answers every prayer: yes, no, or not now, I have something better in mind.



Do we notice? Maybe if we do, we pray, give thanks and then ask for more. If not, God is very patient. He keeps trying. He doesn't ever give up. Remember that God never gives up on us. No matter how far away we drift from Him, He is there waiting for our return.

Today's 1st Reading is from the Book of Exodus (3:1-8a, 13-15) we see Moses being called by God from the burning bush. "...Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground."

Reflection: Do we treat the ground we walk on as holy ground, a gift from God? What does it mean to look at our world as "holy ground"?

Action: This Lent spread the word on the danger of pouring anti-freeze, oil, and other chemicals on the ground, into storm sewers, or down the drain. Toxic or hazardous waste needs to be disposed of properly so it won't pollute air, water and soil. Activity & Prayer: Enjoy the gifts of nature by taking a walk on holy ground and reflecting on God's gifts of creation. This can be done alone or walk with family and friends and talk about how you see God reflected in nature. **Then pray:** Loving God, we thank you and praise you for the beauty in all creation but most of all for _____ (each person on the walk can share a favorite part of nature). Thank you for the beauty of our common home. Amen.

This Lent our parish is putting feet on the gospel by reaching out to the homeless men and women in Tucson through the Sr. Jose Women's Center and the Poverello House. Both of these reach out to the least among us and give them a helping hand, while treating them with the dignity and respect they deserve. Jesus tells us, "Whenever you did for the least of my brothers, you did for me." (Mt 25:40) How can we challenge ourselves to see Christ in the homeless this Lent?

Lent is a good time to look at how we are practicing the Corporal Works of Mercy which include: Feeding the Hungry, Giving Drink to the Thirsty, Clothing the Naked and Sheltering the Homeless. Homeless men and women struggle every day just to meet their basic daily needs.

How Your Change Can Help



1. Find a jar or container to collect change. Due to the pandemic we are unable to hand out jars this year.
2. At dinner pray for the homeless people in Tucson.
3. Add change to your jar each day.
4. On the weekend of Palm Sunday, April 9th & 10th bring your jars of change or envelope marked Lenten Outreach and put it in the baskets on the steps in front of the altar before or after Mass. Jars can also be brought to the Parish office M-F during normal business hours.
5. The money collected will be divided between the Sr. Jose Women's Center and the Poverello House.






