Pastor's Corner

Reflection: All three readings remind us that we need to be reconciled with God. Lent is a joyful season (Laetare) in which to renew our relationship with God and to understand that we as sinners must be our disposition and utmost preoccupation.

The Book of Joshua narrates the Chosen People entering the Promised Land. They then celebrate the Passover for the first time in the Promised Land. The gift of Manna ends for them, and they begin to eat the food of the land. The Chosen People have been reconciled to God and do not need a special food any longer. This reconciliation preceded the military attacks on Jericho; Jericho fell not from the military tactics but through an act of God with the obedient cooperation of his people: a fruit of reconciliation.

The second reading tells us that Jesus Himself is pleading with us to be reconciled to God. The irony is: God always wants us but most often we ignore and refuse Him. He always forgives us, but we remain hardened of hearts, so, we continue sinning. Christ was sent by the Father to bridge the gap and restore us through His grace. St. Paul exhorts us: "We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake He made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him." Yes, He offered his life on the cross to ransom us from our debts. He did his part, it's our time now to do our part – to come to Him with humility and true contrition because if we are in Christ, we become a new creation.

Today's gospel touches the core of our being. Here we see a father whose love goes beyond the logic of human justice. If you have seen the painting "The Return of the Prodigal Son" by Rembrandt van Rijn, here we easily recognize the exact message of the parable: a loving father who always awaits and when the son returns, he runs to embrace him with so much forgiveness and love.

This is who our God the Father is: He will not spurn a humbled and contrite heart. A heart that has been punctured and softened with the Word of God is precious in His sight.

Consecration of Russia and Ukraine: With the ongoing crisis between Russia and Ukraine, the Holy Father Pope Francis, has decided and asked the whole world to consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Last Friday March 25th during the feast of the Annunciation, our parish joined the Universal Church to pray the Consecration for Russia and Ukraine. It was for all of us a moment of hope that this crisis will soon be ended through God's power and the intercession of our dear Mother, the Immaculate Heart of Mary. We continue offering this prayer of consecration during our Mass, Adoration, Rosary and even in our Family and individual prayer. Let us commit to this and keep praying for dialogue, peace and unity and for the conversion of Russia.

Knights of Columbus Membership Drive: I am especially inviting the MEN in our parish to consider becoming a member of the Knights of Columbus. This is an organization whose members are empowered Catholic men whose code of ethics and conduct are centered on the principles of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism. These men live their faith at home, in their parish and in their community. As the Pastor of OMOS I ask you to pray, discern and decide. The Knights of Columbus need you!

Scott Hahn's Talk: I'm certain that those who attended and listened to the talk of Scott Hahn yesterday March 26th were nourished and inspired. This was a great opportunity for us to listen to him in person. I would like to thank you all for taking advantage of the opportunity especially our Liturgical Ministers who I encouraged to participate.



Scripture Reflection

**Fourth Sunday of Lent,
March 27, 2027**

*Joshua 5:9a, 10-12; 2 Corinthians 5:17-21;
Luke 15:1-3, 11-32*

“Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you.”

God forgives all that turn to Him in repentance. Jesus teaches us that all we need to do is take the first step towards the Father and He will come running to meet us.

Most of us know the parable of the Prodigal Son. There are versions on TV. We see or read other forms, but all are the same. The bad boy son returns, repents and is forgiven. Why does that attract us so much? Why don't we believe that God loves us so much that He would truly forgive our sins when we turn back to Him and ask for His forgiveness?

God sent His only Son to die for us. Jesus died for each and every one of our sins. If that's not love, I don't know what is. Total, unconditional love. We just have to accept it. Yes, I know, it's not easy. It's so overwhelming.

But let's remember that this scripture starts with the complaining of the Pharisees and scribes. The teachings of this parable are not just for the lost sheep of the kingdom, but also for the people that allow anger and resentment to keep them out of the celebration. “All these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast with my friends.” The older son resented the lavish love shown to the prodigal. He didn't recognize all he had to do was ask. If you are feeling resentment or anger, all you need to do is ask for God to open up your angry heart to Him as well.

Following God's commands is what we are called to do. We should never think that this makes us better than anybody else. We are called to make disciples of all the nations. How can we do that if we don't join the Father in celebrating when one of our brothers or sisters who “was lost and has been found”?

Msgr. Tom Cahalane used the Prodigal Son parable as part of the Alienated Catholics Anonymous program to welcome people back to the Catholic Church. He would ask the participants, “which son are you?” The parable is about two sons who need God's love. Just like us. Let Him in. Rejoice!

WE'RE ALL PART OF GOD'S PLAN(ET)

In today's gospel we hear Jesus tell the story of the prodigal son (Lk 15:1-3, 11-32). The younger son asks his father for the share of the estate coming to him. After he had squandered his inheritance and was dying from hunger, he comes to his senses and goes back home. The son says to his father, "I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son."

Laudato Si: God has given us this beautiful planet on which everything is interconnected. When we speak of the "environment", what we really mean is a relationship existing between nature and the society which lives in it. Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live. We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it. (138, 139)

Reflection: Much like the younger son in the gospel we alienate ourselves from the natural world. Alienation affirms disconnection and un-relatedness. It says, "I have nothing to do with you. It does not really matter whatever happens to you. It does not bother me at all." Alienation also violates the ordering principle of communion. The universe, the Earth, is ordered towards communion, creatures flourish and comes to fulfillment because of the principles of communion and interconnectedness.

Alienation is a red signal of the ecological crisis. The breakdown of human and ecological conditions calls for the reawakening of a sense of intimacy with the natural world and the elimination of our estrangement from our fellow humans and fellow creatures. We are called to change directions from alienation to intimacy. Intimacy will once again bring us back to communion with all of creation.

Action: This Lent work on relationships with others, creation and the Creator. Ask forgiveness and forgive those who have wronged us. Find a time and place to commune with nature. Just as the younger son came home and asked his father for forgiveness, let us ask God our Father to forgive us and help us develop a sense of intimacy with our fellow humans and all creation.

Prayer: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. For through your goodness you will us to be in communion with You and with all your creation. Forgive our pride, ignorance, and arrogance that alienate You, our sisters and brothers and the natural world, from us. And give us the grace to become more caring and intimate in our relationships. Amen.

This Lent our parish is putting feet on the gospel by reaching out to the homeless men and women in Tucson through the Sr. Jose Women's Center and the Poverello House. Both of these reach out to the least among us and give them a helping hand, while treating them with the dignity and respect they deserve. Jesus tells us, "Whenever you did for the least of my brothers, you did for me." (Mt 25:40) How can we challenge ourselves to see Christ in the homeless this Lent?

5. The money collected will be divided between the Sr. Jose Women's Center and the Poverello House.


