## Fifth Sunday of Lent-April 3, 2022

### Pastor's Corner

**Reflection:** For this Sunday's reflection I would like to offer a reminder that all of us, to some degree or other, have negative images of ourselves. We don't like ourselves. We don't understand how someone else can love us. We have heard parents, teachers, youth ministers, priests and others tell us, rightly so, that we have to fight against the negative feelings we have about ourselves if we are ever going to be mature people and remain balanced in the way we live. The truth is - we are not Mr. or Mrs. Perfect and we never will be. But God loves you and me for who we are, with all our imperfections. And He demands that we love ourselves, not with the love of conceit, "I am the best person in the world," but with the love that says, "I am who God created me to be, with tremendous talents in some areas and less talent in other areas." When we realize that we have failed and did something wrong, it is but a normal reaction to have negative thoughts dominating within us and even controlling us. We become so overwhelmed and affected by it so much so that we reach a point of giving up. We do all sorts of horrible things because we figure, "I am worthless, so why try anyway?"

But, let's take a deeper look at that woman being condemned to death and in front of Jesus. She was sinful. She should have been killed for her sins, at least according to the law of her time. That probably wasn't the first time she committed adultery. She also had probably said, "I am helpless and unworthy person, so why try to be good?" Here Jesus does something that runs counter logic of human law and the condemning attitude of the people around her. He sees the good in the woman, her desire to be freed from that sinful act. Yes, like that woman, He loves you and me. Jesus is picking you up and telling you that he will not hold your sins against you no matter how big they are. He forgives you. Now, go change your life and stop sinning like that.

**The Feast of the Annunciation:** I would like to share some thoughts on this feast which we celebrated last Friday. The Feast of the Annunciation teaches us greatly about the sanctity of life from its very first moments. This marks the moment when God Himself began redeeming all of us by becoming one like us except sin. This tells us how valuable life is in all its stages and in all situations. What is happening now with our families, societies and currently this crisis between Russia and Ukraine, undermine and contradict the very reason why Jesus was sent to us. The Annunciation ushers in the kingdom of life in which we find ultimate victory over the forces of death in our world, society, family and even in ourselves. This feast challenges us to follow Mary's example to protect life and continue to come to her for intercession that we may have the courage to oppose anything evil and anything that destroys life. The Consecration to her Immaculate heart was and is our hope for this.

**The balance between fellowship and prayerful silence:** We have a dynamic and active parish. I am happy that we are back to our in-person worship. But, there are members of the community who expressed that they can not focus in prayer because some people are talking inside the church. There can and should be a balance of fellowship as well as respect for those praying at the same time. The glass doors between the main church and the vestibule provide a buffer and a perfect place to greet each other before Mass. I ask everyone to be sensitive and be considerate and talk with others there. The conversations in the church should be quiet and respectful. If you are preparing for the Mass, be it for the altar, music, hospitality, or other ministries, please make sure we are all preparing quietly and respectfully in our beautiful church. Thank you so much for your understanding.

**Parish Lenten Mission:** Please join us for our Lenten Mission this Monday (April 4th), Tuesday (April 5th), and Wednesday (April 6th) after the 8:30 am Mass. Fr. John Gonzales, Msgr. Tom Cahalane and myself will each take a morning to reflect on Lent. Fr. John will focus on Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving and how they help us to grow in spirituality and holiness. Msgr. Tom will reflect on the Mass: Source and Summit of God's presence and life, and I will be sharing on the brokenness we all experience and highlighting God's mercy and forgiveness.

**Parish Communal Penance:** This will take place on Sunday, April 10th at 4:00 pm out on the parish field and ramada. Please see page 9 in this bulletin for a complete list of communal penances at neighboring parishes.

Lastly, my heartfelt gratitude for everything that you do for our parish. Yes, we can say from our hearts that *"the Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."*

#### Fifth Sunday of Lent April 3, 2022

Isaiah 43:16-21; Philippians 3:8-14; John 8:1-11

“Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone.”

We know none of us is sinless. Pharisees and the scribes had to admit it to themselves as well, which is why they left Jesus and the adulterous woman alone. “Has no one condemned you?”

Jesus himself was without sin. He could have stoned her. He could have condemned her, but He is about love and mercy. “Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore.”

You’ve gone to Reconciliation, you’ve heard Jesus (the priest in the person of Jesus) say something similar to you. Jesus forgives us our sins when we repent. Remember, He already knows everything we do. He isn’t surprised by what we tell Him. He wants us to come back into a state of grace. He wants to send us on our way to sin no more. No matter how many times we sin. He knows that we’re not perfect.

He forgets our sins as well once we confessed them. We need to forgive ourselves, quit beating ourselves up, work on improving and not repeating the same sins again and again. Go and sin no more. That’s what He meant. Learn from our past and work to not repeat it.

Have you ever wondered what Jesus wrote when He was talking to the Pharisees? There’s no record of it. It’s a mystery. Maybe He was writing down the 10 Commandments? Or the commandments He gave to the young man? Love the Lord your God and love your neighbor as you love yourself? Or maybe He was writing the name of the woman? Who knows? What do you think?

How is your Lent going? We’re starting week five. Has it been easy or difficult? Have you made it to Reconciliation yet? There’s lots of opportunities. See the times listed on the cover of the bulletin. The Communal Penance celebration will be April 10 at 4 pm under the ramada. Lighten your load and get back into a state of grace. “Go, and from now on do not sin anymore.”

### Anointing of the Sick



The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will take place on Wednesday, April 6th at the 6:30 pm Mass.

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick,

through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the **serious nature of the illness** is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.




