## *Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord - April 10, 2022*

### Pastor's Corner

*Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.*

– *Philippians 2:6-8*

**Reflection:** Palm Sunday is the beginning of the Passion events. It offers us deep reflection and a moment of mystery. Jesus rides on a donkey entering Jerusalem to fulfill the mission His Father gave him.

In a crowd of people waving palms, chanting songs like *Hosanna*, Jesus knows that these same people will shortly turn on Him. Still, with courage and confidence in God the Father, He moves forward to Jerusalem.

We all have a Jerusalem ahead of us. For us it is not a city, but it might be something that we will experience about life - hardships, problems, challenges and uncertainties. Jesus is showing us how to keep moving and going. For sure, as with our Lord Jesus, maybe many people who say they will be with us, will not be. Yet, we must move forward, facing whatever lies ahead, believing that Jesus has been there before. This is one message for us on Palm Sunday. We are not entering our Jerusalem alone. Jesus has already been there.

### WE'RE ALL PART OF GOD'S PLAN(ET)

Nature is filled with words of love, but how can we listen to them amid constant noise, interminable and nerve-racking distractions, or the cult of appearances? Many people today sense a profound imbalance which drives them to frenetic activity and makes them feel busy, in a constant hurry which in turn leads them to ride roughshod over everything around them. This too affects how they treat the environment. (Laudato Sí, 225)

**Reflection:** Running through Pope Francis' encyclical is a call to ecological conversion. "Conversion" here means change, transformation, or more literally a "turning around" of one's attitudes of mind and heart, a change of behavior. This must take place first on a personal level. But to have lasting effects, conversion must also occur on a community level. Conversion is a passionate conviction about a spirituality that will inspire and lead people to action on personal and communal levels. This kind of spirituality cannot be dissociated from the earth or the body. To say "the Word became flesh" (incarnation) is to say that Jesus was born of matter, having a body like ours. Both divine and human, he was closely connected with other human beings and with his environment. The state of the environment, then, is not simply an economic, technical or political issue, but also a religious and spiritual affair.

**Action:** Determine and put in place the steps needed to carry out the environmental principle "reduce, reuse and recapture" in your home, your school and your workplace. Research and share with your family and friends, guidance for making the best ecological choices when making large purchases such as home appliances, cars and a home.

**Pray:** *Gracious, loving Creator God, You have summoned us at various times and in different ways: "Return to me with contrite mind and heart, and know that I am your God." But so often we have been blind to the presence of your grace, and deaf to the promptings of your Spirit. Forgive our waywardness. May we experience the gift of true repentance and renewal, so that we might experience once again your loving presence. We ask this through our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.*

**Last Rites for the Dying/Extreme Unction**



The Last Rites are a collection of prayers and sacraments that are administered to a person who is in grave danger of dying. They incorporate the Sacraments of Confession (Apostolic Pardon), Anointing of the Sick, and if possible, Eucharist, with the prayers of Apostles' Creed, and Our Father. Attending to the spiritual needs of the dying is one of the most important duties of a Priest. None of us can choose when it's time for us to enter Heaven. Only by God's will can we be called and a priest must prepare for this. It is desirable that the priest be notified when death is inevitable and not at the very last minute when he may or may not be able to get to the location of the dying person. Please use your judgement but give our priests as much "heads up" as possible to insure that your loved one will receive the last rites. Call the parish office at 747-1321 at any time of the day or night and choose the "emergency" option (#1). Thank you.


