## *Divine Mercy Sunday-April 24, 2022*

### Pastor's Corner

**Sunday Reflection:** The gospel reading today from John gives us so many themes to reflect on: forgiveness, Penance, the locked doors, the doubting Thomas and so much more. Though there is one distinct message that this gospel teaches us – that our contact with the Risen Lord is through Faith. This gospel reading is not primarily about Thomas and his doubts. Rather it is about us and our faith.

The Gospel of John fundamentally highlights the importance of Faith. In fact, if you read his prologue, St. John narrates that all who have accepted Jesus and have believed in Him were made empowered sons and daughters of God. The succeeding chapters after that emphasized the importance of faith, its impact on the individual person and it described the dynamics of how people came to believe in Jesus.

Today, we are given this important reminder, when he said to Thomas, “Blessed are they who have not seen and have believed.” This incident with Thomas calls us to enter into a deeper relationship with the Risen Christ as we move beyond a quest for visions to the inward experience of His grace. This meeting of Jesus and Thomas becomes an invitation for us to validate our own Easter faith, which has sustained the Church that we all belong to. Let also be grateful for His Divine Mercy and Love!

**Parish Confirmation and 1<sup>st</sup> Communion:** Last Wednesday, April 20th, Bishop Weisenburger administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to our 8<sup>th</sup> graders at our school. This is something we are so thankful to God for. We need our young people to develop that gift of relationship with our Risen Lord. Confirmation is always a doorway to see that opportunity to love God more deeply and to serve Him in others. To the Confirmandi, their parents and sponsors – Congratulations!

I am also happy to congratulate our First Communicants from our school who received for the first time the Eucharistic Jesus on Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Thank you to Fr. John Gonzales for presiding over this Holy Mass. Our 2<sup>nd</sup> graders and other older children were all in white garments to manifest the purity of their hearts. As the Priest would give them the Eucharistic Jesus and say, “the Body of Christ,” they all answered, “Amen” – a conviction of faith!

Thank you, all dear parents and sponsors, for your support and encouragement of your children. Thank you also to Laura Stehle and the team for the hard work and dedication you have given to prepare these children for their sacraments.

**500 Years of Christianity in the Philippines:** It was a blessing that we are able to celebrate the culmination event of the 500 years of Christianity given to us Filipinos. The coming of the Christian Faith to our Philippine Island is God's gift. This gift of Faith has become an integral part of our Filipino life and culture. In fact, this has sustained us through the many challenges and problems of life caused by so many factors namely, natural calamities, social and political unrest, poverty, violence and drug problems. We have developed resiliency and the resolve to keep fighting to live a better life.

Now, Filipinos are in diaspora all over the world. We bring with us our identity of being friendly and hospitable but more importantly, we bring the faith that we have in the Lord. We are asked by the Holy Father, Pope Francis to walk courageously along the path of missionary discipleship. He said, “Never be afraid to proclaim the Gospel, to serve and to love. Keep bringing the faith, the Good News you received 500 years ago.”



#### Breath of New Life

#### Scott Hahn reflects on the 2nd Sunday of Easter

*Acts 5:12-16, Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24,  
 Revelation 1:9-13, 17-19, John 20:19-31*

The prophet Daniel in a vision saw “one like the Son of Man” receive everlasting kingship (see *Daniel 7:9-14*). John is taken to heaven in today’s Second Reading where he sees Daniel’s prophecy fulfilled in Jesus, who appears as “one like a Son of Man.”

Jesus is clad in the robe of a High Priest (see *Exodus 28:4; Wisdom 18:24*) and wearing the gold sash of a king (see *1 Macabees 10:89*). He has been exalted by the right hand of the Lord, as we sing in today’s Psalm.

His risen body, which the Apostles touch in today’s Gospel, has been made a lifegiving Spirit (see *1 Corinthians 15:45*).

As the Father anointed Him with the Spirit and power (see *Acts 10:38*), Jesus pours out that the Spirit on the Apostles, sending them into the world “as the Father has sent Me.” Jesus “breathes” the Spirit of His divine life into the Apostles—as God blew the “breath of life” into Adam (see *Genesis 2:7*), as Elijah’s prayer returned “the life breath” to the dead child (see *1 Kings 17:21-23*), and as the Spirit breathed new life into the slain in the valley of bones (see *Ezekiel 37:9-10*).

His creative breath unites the Apostles-His Church-to His body, and empowers them to breathe His life into a dying world, to make it a new creation.

In today’s Gospel and First Reading, we see the Apostles fulfilling the mission with powers only God possesses—the power to forgive sins and to work “signs and wonders,” a biblical expression only used to describe the mighty works of God (see *Exodus 7:3, 11:10, Acts 7:36*). Thomas and the others saw “many other signs” after Jesus was raised from the dead. They saw and they believed.

They have been given His life, which continues in the Church’s Word and sacraments, so that we who have not seen might inherit His blessings and “have life in His name.”

**Laudato Si'**: The ultimate destiny of the universe is in the fullness of God, which has already been attained by the risen Christ, the measure of the maturity of all things. Here we can add yet another argument for rejecting every tyrannical and irresponsible domination of human beings over other creatures. The ultimate purpose of other creatures is not to be found in us. Rather, all creatures are moving forward with us and through us towards a common point of arrival, which is God, in that transcendent fullness where the risen Christ embraces and illumines all things. Human beings, endowed with intelligence and love, and drawn by the fullness of Christ, are called to lead all creatures back to their Creator.

**Reflection:** Biblical wisdom about relationships and the inter-connection of all creation helps us to understand the frequent references by Pope Francis to "integral ecology". Ecology is the study of how living things interact with one another and their environment. "Integral" adds an element of completeness: humans and all creatures of land, sea and air, and our environment, are intimately connected as parts of a whole. Harming or destroying part of the whole will cause harm and negative repercussions for another part. If we pollute our streams and rivers, we endanger the lives of the creatures that live in the water and the well-being of the people who live along the banks. All of us are linked by unseen bonds, and together we form a universal family, sharing a common home.

**Easter Season Action:** Spend time outdoors in prayer in your favorite spot. Research and get involved in protecting habitat of wildlife in your area.

**Prayer:** *Glory be to you, O generous Creator God, for the earth, sea and sky. Glory be to you for blessing us with the wondrous array of birds in the air, fish of the sea, and the remarkable diversity of all living creatures. Glory be to you for household pets that give us such joy with their faithful presence. Glory be to you for our families and loved ones who support and sustain us. Glory be to you for our church communities who remind us of your presence. Glory be and thanks to you for bringing us together to reflect on the importance of the earth, our common home. May our time spent together honor your name and bring us joy, hope, and peace. Amen.*


