## Pastor's Corner

**Reflection:** This Pentecost Sunday reminds us of the role and importance of the Holy Spirit. He is the power and life of the Church. He is seen as fire like flames that descended on the apostles. We know what fire is. It can take the form of light that guides our way. It can be heat that warms the chill. It can be a fire that scorches to make way for new growth. The Holy Spirit can work in our life in similar ways. He illuminates our mind to recognize the truth. The Holy Spirit can warm the coldness of hearts alienated from God and others. He can cleanse us and set us free from difficult memories and tragic past. The Holy Spirit can burn out evil from our hearts to leave space for the grace of God.

The Holy Spirit is compared to water. Water irrigates, nourishes, and gives growth. In the life of the church and in personal life, the Holy Spirit gives nourishment to our deepest spiritual longing. We grow in our holiness through the assistance of the Holy Spirit. We persevere and grow in our fidelity because we are given the power of the Holy Spirit.

Whether we experience the Holy Spirit as fire or water, the role of the Holy Spirit is to guide and bring us to what is in accord with the will of Jesus Christ. He is always close to us as the beating of our heart.

**Important Liturgical Celebrations this Month:** Let us welcome the Month of June. We have three important liturgical celebrations during this month. First, we are celebrating Pentecost Sunday today which is the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon Mother Mary and the Apostles. This is also considered the Birthday of our Church for the Holy Spirit is the life of the Church. Let us allow Him to come into our whole being and be animated by Him. Like the Apostles, let us go out and be genuine witnesses to the Truth. I am so grateful for all your participation in all the Masses today.

**June 12<sup>th</sup>** is the celebration of the **Most Holy Trinity**. This is the very foundation of our Catholic Faith. We believe in the Father, in the Son and in the Holy Spirit. When we are all baptized, we are given the indissoluble mark of the Trinitarian character of our faith.

**June 19<sup>th</sup>** is the celebration of the **Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi**. This is to highlight the importance of the Holy Eucharist where we are nourished spiritually daily and every Sunday. Here we do adoration of the Eucharistic Jesus and do consecration asking Him to grant us the graces we need to become holy and the perseverance to do our mission. Let us all be reminded of these upcoming important Solemnities and prepare our hearts for the celebration.

**The Need to Pray Harder:** I am reminding everyone that we really need to pray harder. We are very much bombarded with so many senseless violent attacks and killings being reported in all our news portals. We also witness domestic violence, and we know some friends and acquaintances who also suffer assault and abuses. This is not anymore a normal occurrence but the work of the enemy – Satan! OMOS Parish has been committed to facilitate that great opportunity to pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament and maintain a communal praying of the Holy Rosary. I am hoping we can have First Friday and First Saturday Devotion where we do Adoration on Friday evening in honor of the Sacred Heart and Rosary and Holy Mass on Saturday morning in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. We need to consecrate ourselves to the Sacred Heart and Immaculate Heart. Then Saturday afternoon, I ask everyone to avail the Sacrament of Confession so that your will received the Plenary Indulgence. Let us be prayerful Community. I am hoping we can begin this devotion after Summer.

## Scripture Reflection

### Pentecost Sunday

June 5, 2022

*Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 or Romans 8:8-17; John 20:19-23 or John 14:15-16, 23b-26*



Whoosh! A strong driving wind...tongues of fire! No wonder a crowd gathered to see what was going on!

Jesus ascended into heaven ten days ago. The disciples were waiting in Jerusalem. For what, they didn't know. And then this happens. Noise, wind, flames coming to rest upon each of them. Then they are filled with the Holy Spirit.

Jesus promised an Advocate. He promised to never leave them alone. But until Pentecost, they didn't begin to understand what that meant.

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. The church isn't the building. It is us, the people. It was the Apostles, Mary, all the disciples and their families.

We are all called to proclaim the Good News, to Evangelize, to talk about our faith to those who want to know more. Have you ever done it? Have you ever been asked a question about what you believe and while you're answering (or maybe later) wondered where the words are coming from? The Holy Spirit is helping you, talking through you, spreading the Word of God one person at a time.

By believing and accepting Jesus as your Savior, you've opened yourself up as a conduit for the Holy Spirit. You don't have to be famous or rich or learned. You do have to love Jesus and be willing to talk about your love. Once you are, then whoosh, you too will be filled with the Holy Spirit when you need to be.

Of course, the disciples had been baptized by John and then Jesus had confirmed them in their faith when He breathed on them before He ascended into heaven. If you haven't finished your Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Communion), contact the parish office for more information. The processes will be starting in September, and we can get you enrolled.

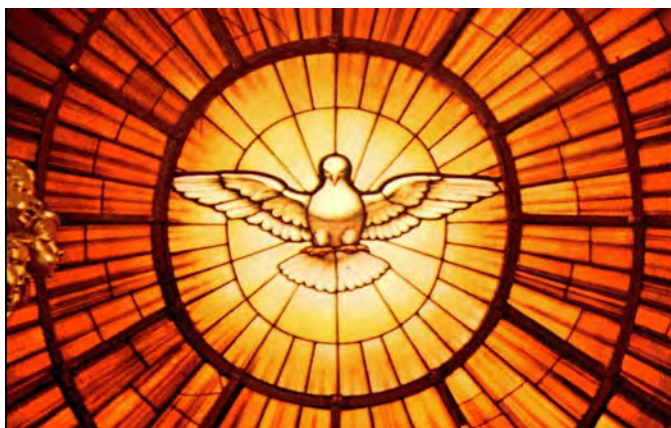
