

## Pastor's Corner

**Reflection:** The Most Holy Trinity is the core of our Christian Faith. Many people believe in God. But Catholics believe that God is three Persons yet one God. It is a difficult yet immensely comforting truth of our faith.

There have been many attempts by theologians over centuries to try to explain the Trinity. They have used various images. St. Augustine used the fact of our intellect has understanding, memory and will, three faculties yet one intellect as a model for the Trinity.



For us this Sunday, let us all renew our baptismal faith in the Trinity. We have God the Father and Creator, God the Son and Redeemer, God the Holy Spirit and Sanctifier not as images but as an indwelling presence in our life. The doctrine of the Trinity according to Fr. Krempa was not a super-scientific discovery, as though the early Church Fathers looked at God through a high-powered telescope and saw three Persons. The doctrine of the Trinity puts into words the Christian experience of God as revealed through Jesus Christ.

It is for us a greater privilege to know God the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit “equal in majesty, and undivided in splendor as part of our life. By the grace given to us, we can continue growing in our relationship with each Person of the Holy Trinity in our spiritual life.

**Letter from Bishop Weisenburger:** On Sunday, June 19th we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. With this feast parishes across our nation will officially begin our observance of the National Eucharistic Revival: My Flesh for the Life of the World. The Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. They believe that God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist and sent out in mission “for the life of the world.”

These three years will culminate in the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in almost fifty years.

As we begin the Year of Diocesan Revival, please join me in marking this feast with a Eucharistic Procession following one (or more) of your Masses on the weekend of the 19th. The attached Planning Aid from the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions (FDLC) offers some suggestions on how this can be done.

We look forward to including Eucharistic teaching and prayer with the diocesan convocation of DRE's and DYM's on August 20th, ongoing formation for priests, deacons and lay ministers throughout the year and celebrations of First Holy Communion several times at the Cathedral.

Thank you for your generous participation and commitment to this most important time in the life of the Church.

## Scripture Reflection

### Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

June 12, 2022

*Proverbs 8:22-31; Romans 5:1-5; John 16:12-15*

“Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; to God who is, who was, and who is to come.” This is from the Gospel acclamation sung today before the gospel reading.

Today we celebrate the Trinity; the three parts of the whole of God: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

As humans, we have trouble understanding the three in one aspect of God. How can one being have three distinct parts? But we all do. Many of us are parents, but we keep our parent life separate from our work life. We are children and friends, too. We have lots more parts too. Think of God that way.

God is love. The Father loves the Son and the Son loves the Father. This love between them creates the Holy Spirit.

Jesus tells the disciples that the Spirit will guide them when He comes. Don't you wonder what Jesus couldn't tell us because we couldn't bear it? We need to pray and follow what the Holy Spirit tells us because He hears what the Father and Son tell Him to pass along.

Last weekend, Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and upon us. Now we are to take from Him and learn from Him. We are now in our 10<sup>th</sup> week of Ordinary Time. We will be in Ordinary Time until November with various saint and holy days celebrated until Advent. This is a time of study and reflection. A time to let the Holy Spirit talk to us and bring us closer to the Father and the Son. A time to help us understand what the love of God is all about.

The Trinity is such an important figure in our Christian life, but such a mystery as well. Because we believe in an all-powerful God, we believe He can be three-in-one and celebrate them and love them no matter the mystery. That is what faith is all about.

### Trinity Sunday

**How does the mystery of the Holy Trinity help us to care for our common home?**

Everything is interconnected, and this invites us to develop a spirituality of that global solidarity which flows from the mystery of the Trinity. (LS, 240)

**Laudato Si':** "The Father is the ultimate source of everything...The Son, his reflection, through whom all things were created, united himself to this earth when he was formed in the womb of Mary. The Spirit, infinite bond of love, is intimately present at the very heart of the universe, inspiring and bringing new pathways" (LS 238)

**Reflection:** As reflections of God, we too, have unique expressions of God by how we live the love of God within us. In nature we see reflected God's beauty, enormous endurance, capacity for unconditional love, and suffering for our sake.

Remember, this is a mystery of our faith and cannot be fully understood. What can be understood is that the nature of God is a community of three Divine Persons, and we can imitate the communal nature of God in our way of being in our families, parish, and world.

We are all one family of God! We need to live as one family in loving care for every member.

**Suggestions for Families:** The Trinity gives us a model for community in families. Every family needs to learn how to live in harmony. **1)** Learning good communication skills helps every family become more loving as a whole. No matter how hard it might be to understand those who may have different opinions, it is always important to respect and to love the person. Imagine how God loves each person. **2)** Ideas, opinions, and expressions may differ, but loving and reverencing each other is the foundation for family love. **3)** Practice the art of keeping silent when the other person is speaking.

**Prayer:** *Holy Trinity of God, give us the graces we need to live in love as a family. We thank you for giving us the example of your loving community. Help us to imitate your loving unity. Amen*




## Pentecost Celebration


