Scripture Reflection

Taking the Call: Scott Hahn reflects on the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 19:16-21; Ps 16:1-2, 5, 7-11; Gal 5:1, 13-18; Lk 9: 51-62



In this week's First Reading, Elijah's disciple is allowed to kiss his parents goodbye before setting out to follow the prophet's call.

But we are called to follow a "greater than Elijah", this week's Liturgy wants us to know.

In Baptism, we have put on the cloak of Christ, been called to the house of a new Father, and been given a new family in the kingdom of God. We have been called to leave behind our past lives and never look back to follow wherever He leads.

Elijah was taken up in a whirlwind and his disciple was given a double portion of his spirit (see 2 Kings 2:9-15).

Jesus too, the Gospel reminds us, was "taken up" (see Acts 1:2, 11, 22), and He gave us His Spirit to live by, to guide us in our journey in His kingdom.

As this week's Epistle tells us, the call of Jesus shatters the yoke of every servitude, sets us free from the rituals of the old Law, and shows us the Law's fulfillment in the following of Jesus, in serving one another through love.

His call sets our hands to a new plow, a new task-to be His messengers, sent ahead to prepare all peoples to meet Him and enter into His kingdom.

Elijah called down to consume those who wouldn't accept God (see 2 Kings 1:1-16). Be we have a different Spirit with us.

To live by His Spirit is to face opposition and rejection, as the Apostles do in this week's Gospel. It is to feel like an exile, with no lasting city (see Hebrews 13:14), no place in this world to lay our head or call home.

But we hear the voice of the One we follow in this week's Psalm (see Acts 2:25-32; 13:35-37). He calls us to make His faith our own-to abide in confidence that He will not abandon us, that He will show us "the path to life," leading us to the fullness of joy in His presence forever.



Gospel: In today's gospel (LK 9:51-62) Jesus calls on disciples to follow him but it was difficult because of other things they needed to take care of.

Pope Francis: Fresh drinking water is an issue of primary importance, since it is indispensable for human life and for supporting terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems. Sources of fresh water are necessary for health care, agriculture and industry. Water supplies used to be relatively constant, but now in many places demand exceeds the sustainable supply, with dramatic consequences in the short and long term. Large cities dependent on significant supplies of water have experienced periods of shortage, and at critical moments these have not always been administered with sufficient oversight and impartiality. Reflect: Here on the desert we are called to discern how we can follow Jesus by using water wisely. Discipleship is not easy and, like we hear in today's gospel, involves choice and commitment. It is a choice how we care for our common home and to limit our water usage. Think about what you can do this summer to conserve water. Take time to pray for those, especially the poor, that suffer because they do not have access to clean drinking water.

Prayer: Creator, we turn our attention to acknowledge and give thanks for Your gift of water. The mighty seas, the calm lakes, the rivers, the streams, and the rain that falls to refresh our sister mother earth.

At the beginning of creation You sanctified the waters. Your gift is indispensable to all life on earth. It grows our food, it sustains all living things physically. When we are in need of spiritual strength You instructed us to go down to the water and wash our spirits clean

Awaken the heart of those who exploit Your gift for profit. And forgive those of us who take Your gift for granted.

Help us to remember the preciousness of Your gift and give us the wisdom to use Your gift wisely and to share it equitably.

Last Rites for the Dying/Extreme Unction

The Last Rites are a collection of prayers and sacraments that are administered to a person who is in grave danger of dying. They incorporate the Sacraments of Confession (Apostolic Pardon), Anointing of the Sick, and if possible, Eucharist, with the prayers of Apostles' Creed, and Our Father. Attending to the spiritual needs of the dying is one of the most important duties of a Priest. None of us can choose when it's time for us to enter Heaven. Only by God's will can we be called and a priest must prepare for this. It is desirable that the priest be notified when death is inevitable and not at the very last minute when he may or may not be able to get to the location of the dying person. Please use your judgement but give our priests as much "heads up" as possible to insure that your loved one will receive the last rites.

Call the parish office at 747-1321 at any time of the day or night and choose the "emergency" option (#1). Thank you.
