## Scripture Reflection

### Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time, July 3, 2022

*Isaiah 66:10-14c; Galatians 6:14-18; Luke 10:1-12, 17-20*



#### **“The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few.”**

Jesus sent out 72 disciples to spread the good news that the Kingdom of God was at hand. He warned them that they were like “lambs among wolves” because the trip would be dangerous for them. He told them not to take anything extra for the trip: no money, no extra shoes, no extra clothes.

Once you get to the town where you're going, if you find someone who will listen, stay there, let your peace rest on them, cure the sick, cast out demons, and eat and drink what is offered to you. You will have earned it.

The disciples returned, rejoicing. They were amazed that even the demons were subject to them. Jesus told them, “do not rejoice because spirits are subject to you but rejoice because your names are written in heaven.”

The laborers hadn't realized what they were doing was evangelizing. Spreading the good news, bringing people home to Jesus is so important. Sometimes, you have to use words, but most of the time though you do it through your actions.

In our troubled world, we need as many people as possible doing good, doing things that are positive and helpful for each other. Without thinking of politics or race or ethnicity. Jesus made it clear when He spoke to the Samaritan woman that He came for EVERYONE! Catholic Christians need to be above worldly fights. We need to think about higher things.

There are lots of opportunities to show you are a Christian today. You never have to say a word. Of course, there's the obvious ones: helping a stranger, donating money, food, or clothes, and I'd never suggest you stop doing those things. They are very much needed! But little things, like smiling at a homeless person acknowledging his existence, letting a car go ahead of you, letting someone with few groceries go in front to pay in the store, hugging your kid for no apparent reason. Saying “I love you” to your spouse out of the blue.

The Lord sees everything you do. Good or bad. The good you don't always get to talk about. But your name gets written in heaven. Rejoice!

## A farewell message from Fr. Joji Vincent-


My dearest Brothers and Sisters

For the month of June, OMOS school has been busy! The preschool students have been exploring the Bible. They have learned all about God's creations and studied the story of Noah's Ark, using art supplies and dramatic play to retell the story visually. ### Pope Francis:

In different ways, developing countries, where the most important reserves of the biosphere are found, continue to fuel the development of richer countries at the cost of their own present and future. The land of the southern poor is rich and mostly unpolluted, yet access to ownership of goods and resources for meeting vital needs is inhibited by a system of commercial relations and ownership which is structurally perverse. The developed countries ought to help pay this debt by significantly limiting their consumption of non-renewable energy and by assisting poorer countries to support policies and programs of sustainable development. (Laudato Si', 52)

### Reflection:

A principle of justice and equity concerns the universal destiny of the goods of the Earth. The world and its bounty have been created for the "good" of all human beings without exception. To live with dignity, every person is entitled to enough food to eat, clean water to drink, housing, and other basic human needs. It is painful to read the words of Pope Francis: "we know that approximately a third of all food produced is discarded, and whenever food is thrown out, it is as if it were stolen from the table of the poor. (Laudato Si', 50) As people created in the image and likeness of God, entitled to self-respect and dignity, we are also worthy of the basic sustenance of life. Assisting poor populations in acquiring the necessities of life is not merely a suggestion, it is a moral imperative.

### Action:

Being together and sharing in a Christian community fosters growth in our faith and our spirituality. However, no communal sharing is complete without a serious commitment to putting our faith into practice. The following are examples of how you can be inspired to act:

1. Organize or join a social justice committee in your parish.
2. Take part in social concerns organizations in your area.
3. Volunteer in a local soup kitchen such as Casa Maria.
4. Organize a food drive for a Tucson Food Bank.



### Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will take place on Wednesday, July 6th at 6:30 pm.

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the **serious nature of the illness** is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.
