Scripture Reflection

Fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time July 10, 2022

*Deuteronomy 30:10-14; Colossians 1:15-20;
Luke 10:25-37*



“And who is my neighbor?”

Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan today. The Jews and Samaritans were enemies, so the Samaritan stopping and giving aid to

the injured Jewish man was unheard of at the time. The scholar answering correctly about who treated the man with mercy should teach us that we should love everyone, no matter their race, color, ethnicity, gender, religion, etc.

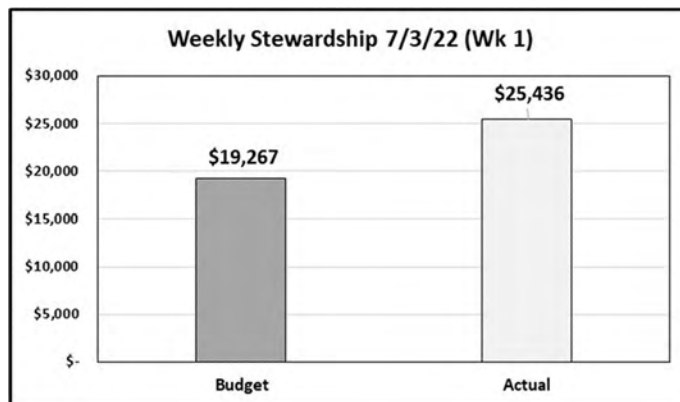
Love doesn't just mean a general care for them in a random way. It means helping out where we can. Offering a bottle of water to a thirsty person on a hot day. Helping make sandwiches for Casa Maria. Donating clothes that you no longer use for Sr. Jose. Listening to a lonely person who needs a friend. There are tons of ways to love someone. If you want more options, contact the parish office. We'll help.

The Lord's words are spirit and life to us. We start each Mass at the Table of the Word. We are fed on the Word of God. Moses brought the Ten Commandments to the people of Israel straight from God. He tried to convey to them how important these words of God were to them. More important at that time than the manna was. We all carry the words of God in our mouths and in our hearts.

We move from the Table of the Word to the Table of the Eucharist. The bread of heaven...the Body of Christ. St. Paul reminds us that Jesus is the head of our church. We celebrate this each week when we celebrate Mass.

Loving everyone isn't easy. But being a Catholic Christian isn't either. Attending Mass every Sunday when there are so many other things to do requires discipline. Giving a day (an hour?) to God, resting in His love for us, praising Him for what He's given us. Is it that hard? Maybe, but stop and think about eternity...wouldn't you rather be praising God for eternity? And thanking Jesus?

Who Is My Neighbor?

Gospel: The well known parable of the Good Samaritan is today's gospel. (Luke:25-37)

Pope Francis: "The loss of forests and woodlands entails the loss of species which may constitute extremely important resources in the future..." "It is not enough, however, to think of different species merely as potential 'resources' to be exploited, while overlooking the fact that they have value in themselves. Each year sees the disappearance of thousands of plant and animal species which we will never know, which our children will never see, because they have been lost for ever. The great majority become extinct for reasons related to human activity." (LS32,33)

Reflect: In the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus tells us that our neighbor is anyone who needs our compassion and care, the person who is suffering, and the person who has been wronged and maltreated and whose rights and dignity have been violated. By the principles of common origin and interrelatedness and by the love that God bestows on every creature, our neighbor is anyone, our fellow humans and our fellow creatures, in God's community of life. Because we are kin to all living creatures, the animals, the trees, the insects, the plants, the fishes, and other life forms are neighbor to us. "Our neighbor is the entire community of life and we must love it all as our very self" (Elizabeth Johnson). As authentic Christian steward of creation, our compassion, respect and care extend to all creation.

Action: Many of our neighbors, whose very existence is threatened, are suffering because of our indifference, neglect and thoughtlessness. We are called to broaden our concept of 'neighbor' to include all of creation. Take some time to reflect and see how you can get involved in the care and protection of the natural world. Support groups that look after endangered species.

Prayer: Praise to you, Lord, God of all creation. For through your goodness, you love and care for all creation. Grant us the grace to see all members of the Earth community as our 'neighbor' toward whom we are called to be compassionate. Amen.
