From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Rejoice in the Lord always!

Certainly, we are not in the best of times yet, but we are so eager now to return to our normal ways of living. This is what we desire now.

The question is, what is the “new normal” way of living? Personally, I don’t know yet. This is something that we need to learn and adapt to. I am anticipating that our government and church leaders are working on something based on the recommendations of our medical experts. We just need to continue to act as one to protect ourselves from this invisible enemy. Bishop Weisenburger sent an e-mail to all parishes saying that “While I’m sure that all of us are anxious to return to our parish churches in person, be assured that any decision to lessen our protocols will be informed by professional advice from medical personnel.”

So, here we are waiting for that time to resume to have “sacramental life” again. I am with you in your frustration, especially for those who would like to come to Mass and receive Jesus through holy communion. We have members of our parish who have been calling the office asking about schedules. I cannot give any final dates for our graduation ceremony, schedules for the administration of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion. I need to wait for the official go signal from the Bishop. I ask for your indulgence to understand my situation.

At the moment, I would like you to continue praying that we may be able to find the cure to the virus. Let us also pray that we may be given more patience and that we may be able to show positive and encouraging words amidst this unprecedented time. I am hoping and praying that our community would be more caring and loving and help protect one another from this virus. Once we resume regular parish activities, (which we don’t know yet - hopefully, soon!) I would ask from you to be extra careful and follow whatever guidelines we will have. Social distancing, wearing masks and washing hands are already the norm so far in this new normal situation.

All in all, I am so grateful for so many things. I saw families interacting, spending time with each other and thereby fostering better relationships; and above all praying together in their respective homes. Also, technology and social media are used to foster better relationships and communication among family, schools, organizations, churches and the like. The “livestream” celebration of the Holy Mass and other prayers has been a source of comfort and inspiration for so many of our parishioners. It gave us a sense of connection and family, no matter what.

Lastly, I am so grateful for families, groups and individuals who have been regularly coming to spend an hour or so in front of the Blessed Sacrament. The church building was not closed. It was and is our spiritual home. God has always been accompanying us. We remain very prayerful and are persevering as a community in our commitment to God.

In the meantime, let us just hope and have faith that we will re-open and resume our parish activities, hopefully soon.

THE TWO HEARTS

Brothers and sisters of Our Mother of Sorrows Parish,

I feel compelled to share with you the following writing, taken from a book of powerful spiritual reflections called "In Sinu Jesu," written anonymously by a Benedictine monk-priest. As Mary's month continues, and as we continue to suffer together through the current multi-faceted crisis, please take these words to heart as though they were from Our Lord Himself:

"I offered myself to the Father from the altar of my Mother's Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart. She accepted, consenting to bear the full weight of My sacrifice, to be the very place from which My holocaust of love blazed up. She, in turn, offered herself with Me to the Father from the altar of My Sacred Heart. There she immolated herself, becoming one victim with Me for the redemption of the world. Her offering was set ablaze in My holocaust by the descent of the Holy Spirit. Thus, from our two hearts become two altars, there rose the sweet fragrance of one single offering: My oblation upon the altar of her heart, and her oblation upon the altar of Mine. This, in effect, is what is meant when ... you speak of My Mother as Co-Redemptrix. Our two hearts formed but a single holocaust of love in the Holy Spirit." (p. 168)

These are beautiful words, but what is the message here for us? It is that Our Blessed Mother also made of herself a perfect sacrifice to God at the foot of the Cross of her Son. Mary's offering would not have been accepted if not for the perfect offering of her divine Son, Jesus. But her own self-offering was also most pleasing to God in its perfection, its beauty, its profound depths. No mere creature could have pleased God more. We imagine what it must have been like for Mary to see Jesus suffer so cruelly and finally die, but we must also consider that Mary willingly gave herself and her own suffering to the Father simultaneously.

If we drink deeply of this mystery, reflecting interiorly upon the suffering of the Mother of the Son, we see then a new dimension of her motherhood toward us: from the Cross Jesus gave us to Mary so that from that moment on she would advocate for us uniquely. Her prayers for us, her spiritual children, touch the heart of her Son in a singular way. Their two hearts were united in inconceivable suffering on Calvary, and so now they are united in indescribable heavenly glory. As spiritually we sojourn together through the month of May, dear friends, be assured that the potent prayers of Our Mother of Sorrows go with us. Take courage in the Lord's free gift of his Most Holy Mother to us, and be assured that He continues to pour out his graces upon the Church even in these most challenging times.

Scripture Reflection

Sixth Sunday of Easter
May 17, 2020

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17; 1 Peter 3:15-18; John 14:15-21

“He will give you another Advocate to be with you always.”

Philip went to the city of Samaria and proclaimed Christ to them. This is the first time in the book of Acts that the Gospel had been preached to people that are not Jews. After the people of Samaria accepted Christ, Peter and John went to the city, laid hands on them, and the people received the Holy Spirit.

Saint Peter tells the Christians of Asia Minor to always be ready to give explanation. But he also warns them to do this with gentleness and reverence. This community was not being attacked in the same manner that a lot of the other Christians were. Instead of persecution, torture, and death, they were being subjected to social ostracism. But that did not make their suffering any less real.

In the Gospel according to Saint John, our reading picks up right after Jesus told his disciples that He is going back to the Father. Imagine their distress. They have only been together for about three years and Jesus is going to leave them. But Jesus reassures them that, if they keep His commandments, He will ask the Father to send the Holy Spirit to be with them always.

Have you ever talked to somebody about your faith and when you are done, you wondered where all your words have come from? That is the Holy Spirit working through you. But, like Saint Peter says on his letter, we should always be ready. God will use what we have in order to bring others closer to Him. It is up to us to make sure that we possess the right tools to serve God. This comes with prayer, worship, and study of the Scriptures and Christian writings.

Our current situation can make it easy to feel that we are not able to grow closer to God since we cannot attend Mass with our community or receive the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. But, as important as those are, there are other ways to grow closer to God. The daily readings, the Liturgy of the Hours, and writings of the early Church fathers are just a few of the many options that we have available. Go to the USCCB website for more ideas. Let us make sure that we have the tools to be ready to bring the Good News to all that we meet once we can safely go back out into the world.

WHEN MASS RESUMES:

Per Bishop Weisenburger:

Those over the age of 60 or any vulnerable adult are still excused from their Sunday obligation.

Children are still not expected to participate so we will not be having altar servers or children's choirs.

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist must wear masks.

Assembly members are encouraged to wear masks.

Hand sanitizers are available at all entrances.

The collection baskets will not be passed but there will be one stationary basket in which parishioners can put their envelopes.

The gifts of bread and wine will already be on the altar and not brought up in procession.

Pews will be marked for 6ft social distancing except in the cases of family seating.

We will follow our regular weekend Mass schedule:

5:30pm on Saturday. 7am, 9am, 10:45am, 12:30pm, 4pm and 6pm on Sunday

200 people may participate in any given Mass. Others will be invited to the parish hall for a concurrent Mass. The exception will be the physically handicapped or hearing impaired who will be allowed into the church.

Church doors will be propped open.

Entry into the church will be from the main two doors only. The other doors will not be accessible. This is in order to keep track of how many people enter the church.

We will not be offering the Precious Blood.

Communicants should receive the Host in their hands.

The Sign of Peace should be offered without contact and there should not be hand-holding for the Our Father.


